#### **Text of Legislative File TB-2021-005**

The Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation budget is funded from a 1/2% sales tax established for the purposes of providing transportation improvements and economic development activities.

The FY2021-2022 Operating Budget will provide funding for debt service and administrative, financial, legal and engineering services, economic development activities and transportation improvements of the Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation.

The amount allocated to Economic Development purposes includes economic incentive payments, the annual contract with the Chamber of Commerce, and downtown improvements and marketing. The businesses that currently receive Economic Incentive Payments (EIP) from the Type B fund are included in this item.

Although the budget is presented as a five-year outlook, the budget is adopted on an annual basis. FY2022 is summarized as follows:

## Transportation

Programmed TCIP\*\* - \$123.3 million Debt service payment - \$3.7 million

Other transportation costs - \$2.1 million

\*\* Includes TCIP amendment #45 that will be presented to the Type B Board on July 22, 2021. TCIP layers in Chisholm Trail North.

## **Economic Development**

Chamber contract - \$0.7 million

Downtown improvements maintenance & marketing - \$0.2 million

Programmed EIP - \$9.1 million

Northeast downtown garage & improvements - \$2.5 million

South Mays Corridor improvements - \$0.3 million

### Text of Legislative File TB-2021-006

A five-year project spending plan will be presented and adopted at least annually to ensure adequate funds are available for transportation, economic development and other allowed uses of Type B funds. This five-year plan will be reviewed by staff at least quarterly and updates will be presented to the Type B board as needed for transportation capital improvements programs (TCIP), economic incentive programs (EIP) and other legally allowable projects approved by the Type B board and by Council.

This agenda item is for the Type B Board to adopt the Five-Year Funds Allocation Plan. The Type B Funds Allocation Plan is attached. The \$321.3 million five-year plan allocates \$287.1 million to committed and planned Transportation Projects and \$34.2 million to Economic Development projects and incentives. This plan includes the costs of projects that will be funded by the Transportation Certificates of Obligation (COs) beginning with the first three of the five planned debt issues with \$30M each in May 2019, May 2020, and May 2021.

This plan will be reviewed and updated at least annually as part of the budget process; significant changes in project needs may require more frequent updates.

#### RESOLUTION NO. TB-2021-007

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation ("TEDCO") is to promote economic development as contemplated by Chapters 501 and 505 of the Texas Local Government Code (the "Code"); and
