The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) was developed in 1974 and works to ensure decent affordable housing and services to the most vulnerable in our communities. To be eligible for CDBG funding, activities must meet one of the three national objectives: 1) Benefit low to moderate income persons 2) Prevent slum or blight 3) Meet an urgent need.

The City of Round Rock is a federal entitlement community under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. As a HUD entitlement community, the City is required to prepare an annual action plan in order to implement any federal programs that fund housing, community development and economic development within the community. The City of Round Rock 2020 Annual Action Plan covers the FY 2020 period from October 1, 2020-September 30, 2021. HUD has allocated \$675,500 in CDBG funds to the City of Round Rock for the 2020 program year action plan. In this CDBG 2020 Action Plan we are requesting public testimony and proposing to fund the following projects:

Public Services: \$101,325

Round Rock Area Serving Center Food Pantry \$25,000
Round Rock Area Serving Center Housing Assistance (Rent/Mortgage) \$25,000
CASA Abused and Neglected Children \$25,000
Opportunities for Williamson-Burnet Counties Meals on Wheels \$10,000
Sacred Heart Community Clinic Health Services \$16,325

Projects: \$439,075

Code Enforcement \$115,000 Minor Home Repair \$194,075 Bus Stops on Mays \$130,000

Program Administration: \$135,100

All requirements for citizen participation have been satisfied during the development of the plan. A public hearing requesting public testimony on this action plan was held before City Council on July 9, 2020, and a 30 day comment period for this plan is from June 9, 2020 thru July 9, 2020. No comments were received at the writing of this report on July 6, 2020.

1. Introduction

The City of Round Rock is a federal entitlement community under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. As a HUD entitlement community, the City is required to prepare an Annual Action Plan in order to implement any federal programs that fund housing, community development, and economic development within the community. The City of Round Rock CDBG 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan covers the period from October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021.

This CDBG 2020 Action Plan is the second annual action plan in the City of Round Rock Five Year Consolidated Plan (2019-2023). The City of Round Rock has been awarded \$675,500 in CDBG funds and in this program year the city is proposing to allocate \$135,100 (20%) for the administration and oversight of the program and \$101,325 (15%) to the following public services:

- Round Rock Area Serving Center: Food Pantry Program \$25,000
- Round Rock Area Serving Center: Housing Assistance Program \$25,000
- CASA of Williamson County: Child Advocacy Program \$25,000
- Sacred Heart Community Clinic: Expanded Access of Primary Medical Care \$16,325
- Opportunities for Williamson & Burnet Counties: Meals on Wheels \$10,000

In addition to funding program administration and public services, the City is proposing to fund the following projects:

- City of Round Rock Minor Home Repair: \$194,075
- City of Round Rock Transportation Department/Bus Stops at Mays Street:\$130,000
- City of Round Rock Planning Department/Code Enforcement: \$115,000

The following is project activity summary of the CDBG Program Year 2018 from the most recent CAPER submitted to HUD and also projects that have been completed after the last CAPER was submitted that include CDBG Program Year 2019 activities:

- Round Rock Area Serving Center Food Pantry Program expended all 2018 CDBG funds in the amount of \$25,000 and assisted 860 households with food from their food pantry.
- Round Rock Area Serving Center Housing Assistance Program expended all 2018 CDBG funds in the amount of \$25,000 and assisted 254 households with rent or mortgage assistance.
- CASA Child Advocacy Program expended all 2018 CDBG funds in the amount of \$25,000 and assisted 91 abused or neglected children in court.
- Council on At-Risk Youth expended all 2018 CDBG funds in the amount of \$13,500 and assisted 151 at-risk youth with counseling.
- Sacred Heart Community Clinic expended all 2018 CDBG funds in the amount of \$12,500 and assisted 312 low income residents with health services.

- Sacred Heart Community Clinic expended all 2019 CDBG funds in the amount of \$12,500 and assisted 105 low income residents with health services.
- Frontier Park improvements were completed and all 2017 & 2018 funds were expended in the amount of \$302,973.04
- The Austin Street Sidewalk project was completed in program year 2018 and a total of \$187,207 was expended.
- CDBG 2016 Greenhill Sidewalk Project was completed in 2019 and \$120,973 was expended this program year.
- A total of seven homes participated in Minor Home Repair and were completed in program year
 2019. \$18,647.80 was expended during this program year.
- Program Administration was completed and the full 20% was expended in the amount of \$134,879.
- Hope Alliance Domestic Violence Shelter ADA Playground and Shade Structure was completed during the 2019 program year and expended \$32,700.

The first public hearing was a "Needs Assessment" public hearing that was held on April 9, 2020. The second public hearing was held on July 9, 2020. No comments were received. The notices for these public hearings were advertised in the Round Rock Leader newspaper in English and Spanish as well as posted at the following locations:

- City Hall Kiosk on first floor
- Kiosk at the Alan R. Baca Senior Center
- Round Rock Housing Authority
- Round Rock Library

In addition to the public hearing notice, an Executive Summary were made available as well.

The City of Round Rock always wants to continue to make efforts to broaden public participation during the development of the plan. This year with the mandatory shut-downs of city buildings and neighborhood facilities due to COVID-19, citizen participation was limited. Once offices and facilities opened up, citizen participation was encouraged but because of the continued anxiety about COVID-19 many residents continued to stay home and stay safe.

In order to broaden citizen participation in the future, Round Rock did amend their Citizen Participation Plan to include policies for citizen participation during emergencies and disasters.

1. Introduction

The City of Round Rock has developed an outreach effort to encourage input from a large cross section of residents and stakeholders. The outreach effort included two public hearings before city council, published and posted meeting notices, social media notifications, emails and flyers.

In addition to reaching out during the development of the plan, City of Round Rock CDBG staff continues to maintain a strong networking relationship with public and assisted housing providers and private and governmental health, mental health and service agencies throughout the program year.

Provide a concise summary of the jurisdiction's activities to enhance coordination between public and assisted housing providers and private and governmental health, mental health and service agencies (91.215(I))

In order to enhance coordination and form effective relationships between public and assisted housing providers, private and governmental health, mental health and service agencies, the City of Round Rock actively consults with a variety of non-profits, social service providers, neighborhoods and citizens, and other governmental agencies. CDBG staff attend monthly Williamson County Non-Profit Networking Meetings the first Tuesday of every month at the Alan R. Baca Senior Center. Local non-profits come together to network and also to promote meetings, public hearings and events. A variety of non-profits attend the monthly networking meetings including non-profits that provide housing, mental health, health, transportation, affordable childcare and other services to low income, disabled and elderly residents of Round Rock.

CDBG staff attends the Round Rock Housing Authority (RRHA) monthly board meetings as well as meets regularly with the RRHA staff to provide technical assistance on the CDBG grant and to work together on the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Regional Working Group goals and action items.

CDBG staff along with other local non-profits and social service agencies met regularly to discuss the needs of homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless. The goals of this group is to eventually form a homeless coalition and also try to find resources to fill the gaps within the community regarding homeless and at-risk homeless. among the agencies that meet each month include food pantries, mental health agencies, neighboring local units of government, housing agencies, local and neighboring housing authorities, local not for profit health clinics, and Texas Homeless Network staff.

Describe coordination with the Continuum of Care and efforts to address the needs of homeless persons (particularly chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans, and unaccompanied youth) and persons at risk of homelessness.

Currently at this time there are no agencies receiving Continuum of Care (COC) grant funding in Round Rock or Williamson County. As per the THN, they have not had participation in the Texas Balance of State COC (TX BOS COC) from homeless service providers in Williamson County for some time. Currently there is not an active local homeless coalition in the area so the Round Rock CDBG staff with the help of the Round Rock Housing Authority director has started meeting quarterly to discuss the needs of the homeless and those in danger of becoming homeless.

The City of Round Rock is making an effort to address the needs of homeless persons and persons at risk of homelessness by funding the following with either CDBG or General Funds:

- Round Rock Area Serving Center Food Pantry that assists those that are homeless and at-risk of becoming homeless with \$25,000 of CDBG 2020 funds.
- Round Rock Area Serving Center Rent/Mortgage Assistance for those that are at-risk of becoming homeless with \$25,000 of CDBG 2020 funds.
- Round Rock Area Serving Center Rent/Mortgage/Food Pantry for those that are at-risk of becoming homeless and that need assistance with food during the COVID-19 Pandemic with City of Round Rock General Funds in the amount of \$45,000.
- Hope Alliance Domestic Violence Shelter with \$32,700 in General Funds to assist victims of domestic violence that are homeless.
- Texas Baptist Children's Home with \$10,000 in general funds to assist single mothers and their children in transitional housing.
- Sacred Heart Community Clinic with \$16,325 in CDBG 2020 funds to assist and provide medical services to low income and those that are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless.

City of Round Rock CDBG staff networks with the Round Rock ISD Families in Transition

Coordinator. The Families in Transition Program assists homeless families with children, families with
children that are living with friends or relatives as well as unaccompanied youth. The role of the
coordinator is to ensure that any student lacking a fixed, adequate and regular nighttime residence is
provided with resources. Because there are no homeless shelters in Round Rock or Williamson County
(except for the domestic violence shelter) homeless youth and unaccompanied youth are bused to
shelters in Austin. According to the RRISD, a third of homeless students are unaccompanied youth.

Goodwill of Round Rock and Central Texas provides job rehabilitation and placement for homeless veterans as well as assistance with rent and job training. Currently due to COVID-19 the Round Rock location is closed but are taking intake applications for serves over the phone. The City CDBG staff will continue to network with the Goodwill to stay up to date on services that are being provided to homeless veterans.

The CDBG staff maintains a strong relationship with staff at the Bluebonnet Trails & Community Services (BBT) Round Rock location. BBT provides an array of services to the low income and homeless and at-

risk homeless that include a supportive housing and transitional housing program and behavior health services.

At this time the City CDBG staff is not consulting with any nor are there any Continuum of Care recipients that serve this jurisdiction. As stated above, the City of Round Rock staff has started networking and forming a relationship with the Texas Homeless Network staff to stay informed of what is happening in the TX BOS COC regarding homelessness as well as encouraging homeless providers in Williamson County to join the effort to end homelessness.

CDBG staff does not network with any corrections programs or institutions other than the Council for At-Risk Youth. CDBG funded the Council for At-Risk youth in program year 2019 to provide counseling to at-risk youth in the ISD from grades 5-12. Other than that agency the CDBG staff does not network with any other corrections program or institution but the City of Round Rock HR department does participate in the Jails to Jobs Program. This program is literally transforming lives by breaking the cycle of youth recidivism. The Jails to Jobs Program empowers juvenile offenders to find purpose, personal growth and achievement through an employment-based mentoring and job skills program, in order to reduce recidivism in the justice system. The City of Round Rock guarantees graduates of this program a job.

Currently the CDBG staff does not have a working relationship with business or civic leaders but does work with the Realtor Association of Round Rock every April for Fair Housing Month and to invite them to the Fair Housing Workshop hosted by CDBG staff and the Austin Tenant's

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Council. Austin Tenant's Council provides Fair Housing Education and Counseling, assists with filing fair housing discrimination complaints as well as tenant/landlord issues and mediation. The CDBG staff has a strong working relationship with Austin Tenant's Council.

The City of Round Rock does not receive Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) nor does Williamson County have agencies participating or actively applying for the COC grant. The city has started to work with Texas Homeless Network and non-profit agencies in the Round Rock/Williamson County area to try and start a conversation regarding the homeless persons and resources available to address these issues.

In an effort to promote citizen participation during the development of the CDBG 2020 Action Plan, public hearing notices in English and Spanish were made available at the following locations and agencies:

The public participation process was developed to help the City of Round Rock identify priority needs in the community and set goals that will help address affordable housing needs and to better provide social services to the low to moderate income household and persons. Two public hearings were held before city council during the development of the plan. Residents were given at least 14 day notice of a public hearing and at least 30 days for the comment period. Copies of the public notices and proof of publications from the Round Rock Leader.

The projects and activities funded in this action plan all tie back to the high priority needs and goals in the CDBG Five Year Consolidated Plan (2019-2023). During the development of the five year consolidated plan the City CDBG staff had a goal and plan for citizen participation to ensure a broad participation of residents, housing, economic and social service providers as well as city departments and local housing authority. The City held stakeholder and resident meetings in addition to public hearings. This process helped the City develop the consolidated plan to assist for planning and developing the action plans for the next five years. Should goals or high priority needs change, the city will conduct a substantial amendment to add goals.

Describe the reasons for allocation priorities and any obstacles to addressing underserved needs

Allocation priorities were based upon the Needs Assessment undertaken as part of the planning process and demand for projects and services in the past. The City identified Mays Street as an area that needed improved bus stop accessibility and the need for additional transportation options for traditionally transportation disadvantaged populations. This includes economically disadvantaged people, older adults and people wiht disabilities, limited English speaking persons and those with limited access to vehicles. Unfortunately, the need for infrastructure far exceeds the amount of CDBG funding available. The primary obstacle to addressing underserved needs is the limited resources available to address such needs throughout the City. The Public Services fund of 15% is also oversubscribed at far beyond what is available. The City encourages CDBG applicants to seek other resources from other public and private entities to leverage the limited amount of CDBG funds available.

AP-60 Public Housing — 91.220(h)

Introduction

The Round Rock Housing Authority was established in 1966, with the first development built in 1972. Today, the Round Rock Housing Authority owns 100 units and administers 94 Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers. Approximately 200 persons are assisted through these programs. The City of Round Rock will act as a resource for the Round Rock Housing Authority to assist the public housing authority with capacity building as well as programming that is associated with CDBG funds.

The RRHA is a five-member board, including a resident board member, and oversees the Round Rock Housing Authority. The board is appointed by the City of Round Rock Mayor. The City is invested in ensuring that selections made are in the best interest of the Round Rock Housing Authority. Each board member appointed by CORR Mayor possess management qualities that will ensure that best business practices are deployed.

Actions planned during the next year to address the needs to public housing

To address and improve the needs of public housing and resident initiatives, the Round Rock Housing Authority (RRHA) will continue to provide youth services at the Westwood location. The Boys to Men group, headed by Robert Hall, is a program which focuses on developing strong character skills for young children and youth. It is housed at the Westwood apartments owned by RRHA. Many of the young people who participate in the program do not have strong role models at home or come from blended families and single parent households. The young people in Boys to Men benefit from having someone they can confide in and interact with on a regular basis. Some of the activities include team sports, day trips to parks and lessons on the importance of being good citizens. Boys to Men relies primarily on donations and volunteers.

Another program that the RRHA provides its residents to meet their needs for self-sufficiency is the Family Self Sufficiency Program (FSS). This program provides affordable housing expertise, homeownership grant resources and programming initiatives to promote self-sufficiency for the program participants. The FSS program serves families in the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program the Public Housing Programs. Past and present participants have completed the following goals:

- Obtained and maintained employment
- Ability to pursue higher education
- Ability to maintain first time businesses with supportive mentorship and education

The unique value of the FSS Program is that clients can receive supportive case management to reach their individual goals towards self-sufficiency.

In addition to this, the RRHA continues to partner with several local agencies, faith-based organizations,

the City of Round Rock and the school district in order to bring resources to the residents of the housing authority.

Actions to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

Currently there are no public housing homeownership initiatives in place either under the public housing program or the Section 8 program. The City of Round Rock plans to encourage Affordable Housing Roundtables that are conducted by the RRHA and include affordable housing builders, housing counseling nonprofits and banking institutions.

If the PHA is designated as troubled, describe the manner in which financial assistance will be provided or other assistance

The Round Rock Housing Authority is not designated as troubled housing authority by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The City of Round Rock and Williamson County are part of the Texas Balance of State Continuum of Care (BoS CoC). The BoS CoC is part of the Texas Homeless Network (THN), a nonprofit membership-based organization helping Texas communities to prevent and end homelessness. THN is a 501(c)(3) organization that is partially funded through Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs and Texas Department of State Health Services.

Describe the jurisdictions one-year goals and actions for reducing and ending homelessness including

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

At this time in the City there are no agencies receiving Continuum of Care (COC) grant funding. The City of Round Rock CDBG staff has reached out to the Texas Homeless Network (THN) to stay informed on the homeless population issues and efforts to end homelessness in Central Texas.

In an effort to reduce and end homelessness the City of Round Rock has developed the following oneyear goals:

1. City of Round Rock CDBG staff will continue to consult with the Texas Homeless Network/TX BoS CoC to discuss the next steps to actively participate in the effort to end homelessness in Williamson County. Reach out to Williamson County CDBG staff and partner with them in this effort.Reach out to non-profit agencies that provide services to homeless persons in Williamson County and encourage them to participate in coming together to discuss the homeless issues in the area. Set up a meeting that includes the homeless providers in Williamson County and a presentation by the Texas Homeless Network on the steps and process to plan a "Point in Time" count in January 2021, discuss forming a Local Homeless Coalition in Williamson County as well as provide information on the COC grant. Continue networking with the Round Rock ISD homeless liaison. Continue funding the Round Rock Area Serving Center with CDBG 2020 funds to assist with rent/mortgage and food.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

The following agencies provide temporary shelter, transitional housing and other services and are being funded with 2020 CDBG or general fund dollars:

• The Williamson County Crisis Center (Hope Alliance) offers emergency shelter for victims of

- domestic violence and sexual assault. (\$35,000 from 2020 General Fund Social Services Grant)
- Round Rock Area Serving Center provides emergency shelter, food and clothing vouchers as well
 as mortgage and utility assistance in an effort to address/prevent homelessness. (\$50,000 with
 2020 CDBG)
- Texas Baptist Children's Home provides a variety of residential and nonresidential services for children and families in need—these include housing for children and single-mother families as well as outreach and prevention services. (\$10,000 2020 General Fund Social Service Grant)

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

The City of Round Rock is making an effort to address the needs of homeless persons and persons at risk of homelessness by funding the following with either CDBG or General Funds:

- Round Rock Area Serving Center Food Pantry that assists those that are homeless and at-risk of becoming homeless with \$25,000 of CDBG 2020 funds.
- Round Rock Area Serving Center Rent/Mortgage Assistance for those that are at-risk of becoming homeless with \$25,000 of CDBG 2020 funds.
- Round Rock Area Serving Center Rent/Mortgage/Food Pantry for those that are at-risk of becoming homeless and that need assistance with food during the COVID-19 Pandemic with City of Round Rock General Funds in the amount of \$45,000.
- Hope Alliance Domestic Violence Shelter with \$32,700 in General Funds to assist victims of domestic violence that are homeless.
- Texas Baptist Children's Home with \$10,000 in general funds to assist single mothers and their children in transitional housing.
- Sacred Heart Community Clinic with \$16,325 in CDBG 2020 funds to assist and provide medical services to low income and those that are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless.

City of Round Rock CDBG staff networks with the Round Rock ISD Families in Transition Coordinator. The Families in Transition Program assists homeless families with children, families with children that are living with friends or relatives as well as unaccompanied youth. The role of the coordinator is to ensure that any student lacking a fixed, adequate and regular nighttime residence is provided with resources. Because there are no homeless shelters in Round Rock or Williamson County (except for the domestic violence shelter) homeless youth and unaccompanied youth are bused to shelters in Austin. According to the RRISD, a third of homeless students are unaccompanied youth.

Goodwill of Round Rock and Central Texas provides job rehabilitation and placement for homeless

veterans as well as assistance with rent and job training. Currently due to COVID-19 the Round Rock location is closed but are taking intake applications for serves over the phone. The City CDBG staff will continue to network with the Goodwill to stay up to date on services that are being provided to homeless veterans.

The CDBG staff maintains a strong relationship with staff at the Bluebonnet Trails & Community Services (BBT) Round Rock location. BBT provides an array of services to the low income and homeless and atrisk homeless that include a supportive housing and transitional housing program and behavior health services to veterans.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); or, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs.

In an effort to help low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, the City of Round Rock will continue to fund the Round Rock Area Serving Center with CDBG 2020 funds for the following activities:

- Food Pantry Program in the amount of \$25,000
- Housing Assistance Program (help with rent/mortgage) in the amount of \$25,000

Funding these two programs will help those at-risk of becoming homeless not have to choose between food/rent and other necessities.

CDBG staff does not network with any other corrections program or institution but the City of Round Rock HR department does participate in the Jails to Jobs Program. This program is literally transforming lives by breaking the cycle of youth recidivism. The Jails to Jobs Program empowers juvenile offenders to find purpose, personal growth and achievement through an employment-based mentoring and job skills program, in order to reduce recidivism in the justice system. The City of Round Rock guarantees graduates of this program a job.

The CDBG staff maintains a strong relationship with staff at the Bluebonnet Trails & Community Services (BBT) Round Rock location. BBT provides an array of services to the low income and homeless and atrisk homeless that include a supportive housing and transitional housing program and behavior health

services to veterans those recently released from mental health facilities.

BBT helps veterans with the tools they need to successfully integrate back into the community and transition from military life to civilian life again.

Discussion

AP-75 Barriers to affordable housing – 91.220(j)

Introduction:

Actions it planned to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment

In an effort to remove barriers to affordable housing the Round Rock City Council unanimously approved a resolution of support that gave develops a green light to seek low-income housing tax credits from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs to help finance the project that includes approximately 200 units of income restricted senior housing. Plans for the development call for a mixture of studios and one and two bedroom units. Building height is anticipated to be three stories.

Council has also approved several Planned Unit Developments that allow for detached single family housing units on condominium lots. By providing this housing alternative to standard single family home on fee simple lots, developers are able to offer quality housing units at a lower price points due to reduced infrastructure and public improvement costs. These types of single family condominium developments are being recommended for infill or remnant tracts where larger scale residential developments would not be feasible.

In addition, the city has the following actions planned to continue to address the barriers to affordable housing in the next program year:

- City of Round Rock will fund Round Rock Area Serving Center's Housing Assistance Program with program year 2020 CDBG funds, which provides housing and emergency shelter needs, helps elderly maintain independence, and helps families avoid eviction and homelessness.
- The City of Round Rock will fund with program year 2020 CDBG funds minor home rehabilitation for up to 8 homes in Round Rock.
- City of Round Rock CDBG Staff will promote and direct residents to TDHCA's down-payment assistance program;
- City of Round Rock CDBG Staff will participate and work with the Central Texas Regional Fair Housing Group to work with foundations and private partners to create the multifamily rehabilitation and accessibility improvement program; and
- City of Round Rock CDBG staff will participate on the affirmative marketing program and guiding principles for developers of rental housing along with the Central Texas Regional Fair Housing

Group.

AP-85 Other Actions – 91.220(k)

Introduction:

This section of the Consolidated Plan outlines actions planned to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs in Round Rock.

Actions planned to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs

Despite efforts, there remain a number of significant obstacles to meeting underserved needs. The following obstacles to meeting these needs in Round Rock are population growth; high cost of housing; cut backs in state and federal funding for basic needs and the need for transportation to existing services and childcare exceed available resources to meet these needs. To address the population growth and the high cost of housing, the Round Rock Area Serving Center provides rent/mortgage, food pantry and utility assistance. The City funded the RRASC for these programs with CDBG program year 20 funds totaling \$50,000.00. The City also funded the Sacred Heart Community Clinic with \$16,325 in CDBG funds for program year 20. Sacred Heart Community Clinic provides dental services, acute care, chronic care and provides medications as well to the very low-income uninsured residents.

The following programs also help address the cutbacks in state and federal funding and the need for childcare and transportation to existing services:

Senior Access provides door to door transportation to seniors to doctors' appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, to pay bills, and to social service agencies for services. Senior Access is being funded in 2020 with City General Fund Social Services Funds in the amount of \$35,000.

Foundation Community provides free tax preparation to low- to moderate-income families. Foundation Communities Tax Preparation Program is being funded in 2020 with City General Fund Social Service Funds in the amount of \$15,000.

In order to meet transportation demand, the City developed a fix route bus service that was designed and focused on access to employment services to meet the needs of the low-income and minority populations to jobs, education and employment. This service offers ADA paratransit services as well for anyone with a disability that prevents them from being able to ride any fixed route vehicle, disembark from any fixed route vehicle or travel independently all or some of the time on any fixed route vehicle.

Council has also passed an ordinance that allows Round Rock Transit to sell discount bus passes to nonprofit and government agencies for the purpose of distributing the passes to low-income persons and families that meet the participation requirements.

The City also provides residents with the Guide to Affordable Housing in the Greater Austin Area that is provide by the Austin Tenant's Council. This guide is a tool for people seeking affordable rental housing in the Austin area that includes Round Rock. The guide contains general information on housing

Annual Action Plan

programs funded on the local, county, state and federal levels, as well as specific information about apartment complexes participating in these programs. It contains lists and explanations of rental housing with rent restrictions, income-based rents and tenant income limits.

The City's General Fund provides funding of \$35,000 to Hope Alliance, an organization that meets short housing needs for survivors of domestic violence. The City's General Fund also provides \$10,000 in funding for the Texas Baptist Children's Home for an interventional specialist to help residents in a holistic approach.

Actions planned to foster and maintain affordable housing

The City of Round Rock will continue to support the following programs in program year 20 that support affordable housing. These include:

- The housing assistance program through the Round Rock Area Serving Center to assist residents with rent or mortgage at up to \$100 a household; and
- The minor home repair program for low-income homeowners in Round Rock.

Round Rock Area Serving Center Housing Assistance Program will be funded with CDBG 2020 funds in the amount of \$25,000 and the Minor Home Repair Program will be funded with 2020 CDBG funds in the amount of \$194,075.

Actions planned to reduce lead-based paint hazards

The majority of residential housing development in Round Rock occurred after the use of lead-based paint was banned; however, some areas of the community may have some homes with lead-based paint.

With the implementation of the Minor Home Repair Program, the program policy and procedures manual addresses compliance with the Residential Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 (Title X) and subsequent changes in September 1999. The procedures include:

- 1. Notification
- 2. Identification
- 3. Treatment (if necessary)

The City of Round Rock will continue to fund the Minor Home Repair Program with 2020 CDBG funds. Applicants who are eligible for the Minor Home Repair program are provided LBP information at the

time of intake and will be made aware of possible dangers of LBP.

Actions planned to reduce the number of poverty-level families

During the 2020 CDBG program year the City of Round Rock will take the following actions to reduce the number of poverty level families:

- The City will continue to fund the Minor Home Repair Program with 2020 CDBG funds to provide minor home repair for the low and very low-income residents in Round Rock. This program proposes to assist an estimated total of 8 households with repairs to include fence, plumbing, electrical, weatherization, and ADA improvements.
- Round Rock Area Serving Center will continue to be funded with CDBG program year 2020 funds to provide rent and mortgage assistance and access to their food pantry. These programs collectively propose to assist 1,200 households.
- Sacred Heart Community Clinic will be funded with \$16,325 in CDBG 2020 funds to assist poverty level families with health and dental care and medications at no cost to them. This program proposes to assist 100 households.
- The Meals on Wheels of Williamson and Burnet Counties program will be funded with \$10,000 in 2020 CDBG funds to prepare lunch meals for seniors at Baca Center and for homebound seniors
- The Foundation Communities Free Tax Preparation Program will continue to be funded with 2020 General Fund Social Service Funds in the amount of \$15,000 that will provide poverty level families free tax preparation. This program proposes to assist 1200 households.
- The City will continue to fund the YMCA After-School Scholarship Program with 2020 General Fund Social Service Funds in the amount of \$5,000 that will assist very low-income working families with no cost after school care. This program proposes to assist 7,000 residents.
- The Literacy Council will continue to be funded in 2020 with City of Round Rock General Fund Social Service Grant fund in the amount of \$10,000 that will provide self-sufficiency education (ESL, Basic Literacy, and GED tutoring). This program proposes to assist 275 individuals.

Actions planned to develop institutional structure

In order to bridge the gap, the City relies on a network of public sector, private sector, and nonprofit organizations to implement the Strategic Plan, particularly to address homelessness and special needs. The City Council evaluates their Strategic Plan and Annual Budget from a citywide perspective. During these discussions' resources are provided to fund programs not specifically covered by CDBG but will provide more funds toward homelessness and special needs programs.

The City continues to actively consult with a variety of nonprofits, social service providers, neighborhoods and citizens, and other governmental agencies. CDBG staff attend the monthly Williamson County Nonprofit Networking meetings the first Tuesday of every month at the

Alan R. Baca Senior Center. Local nonprofits come together to network and also to promote meetings, public hearings and events. A variety of nonprofits attend the monthly networking meetings including nonprofits that provide housing, mental health, health, transportation, affordable childcare and other services to low-income, disabled and elderly residents of Round Rock.

CDBG staff attends the Round Rock Housing Authority (RRHA) monthly board meetings as well as meets regularly with the RRHA staff.

In order to address gaps in institutional structure around homelessness, Round Rock CDBG staff has consulted with the Texas Homeless Network/TX BoS CoC and discussed the next steps to actively participate in the effort to end homelessness in Williamson County. In an effort to meet these goals, Round Rock CDBG staff has started work on the following:

- Reach out to Williamson County CDBG staff and partner with them in this effort
- Reach out to nonprofit agencies that provide services to homeless person in Williamson County and encourage them to participate in coming together to discuss the homeless issues in the area.
- Continue meeting with these non-profits in the 2020 program year and include the Texas
 Homeless Network (THN) which will guide us and help us with the steps and process to plan a
 "Point-in-Time" count, to discuss in forming a Local Homeless Coalition in Williamson County, as
 well as provide information on the COC grant.

Actions planned to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies

In an effort to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies, the City of Round Rock will continue to fund the Round Rock Area Serving Center/Volunteer Center with \$35,000 in 2020 General Fund Social Service funds that will help pay for the Volunteer Center Coordinator salary. The Volunteer Coordinator not only supplies volunteers and manages volunteers' opportunities but also continues to coordinate and host the Williamson County Monthly Networking Meetings. These meetings are held the first Tuesday of every month at the Alan R. Baca Senior Center. At this monthly networking meeting, nonprofit and social service agencies come together to network, promote events and listen to guest speakers. Up to 30 agencies attend the monthly meetings and have access the groups list serv and be able to share information on the upcoming events, public hearing and fundraisers. Collaboration and coordination between agencies is important to ensure that the needs in the community are being addressed.

As noted above, the City CDBG staff also attend the monthly Williamson County Nonprofit

Networking meetings the first Tuesday of every month at the Alan R. Baca Senior Center and attends the
Round Rock Housing Authority (RRHA) monthly board meetings as well as meets regularly with the RRHA

staff.

Discussion:

The City of Round Rock, Office of Community Development is responsible for the administration of the City's programs funded with CDBG funds. This office has the primary responsibility for managing and implementing the City's affordable housing and infrastructure program, the Consolidated and Annual Plans and related documents.

The City of Round Rock has developed a monitoring system to ensure that the activities carried out in the Plan are done so in a timely manner in accordance with the federal monitoring requirements of [24 CFR 570.501 (v)] and [24 CFR 85.40] and all other applicable laws, regulations, policies and sound management and accounting practices.

Sub-recipients are monitored to ensure that they have implemented and administered their CDBG funded activities according to applicable federal requirements. Particular attention is paid to compliance with management systems, procurement practices and compliance with civil rights requirements.

When applicable, sub-recipients are required to submit copies of paid receipts, timesheets, income documentation, client data and self-certification forms with their monthly requests. This information is used to determine the number of unduplicated beneficiaries. Monthly reports are submitted by each sub-recipient enabling staff to monitor the progress of each activity, provide technical assistance or consultation when needed and to ensure that all objectives are met.

The City of Round Rock conducts monitoring of sub-recipients every program year during the summer. Particular attention is paid to compliance with eligibility and national objective requirements. The HUD monitoring checklist is used during these on-site monitoring visits. The monitoring visits are conducted by the CDBG Program Coordinator. Technical assistance is provided for sub-recipients at the beginning of the program year and anytime during the program year upon request.

Throughout the year, staff conducts mini desk reviews of all sub-recipients. Sub-recipients are required to submit monthly progress reports and reimbursement requests by the 15th of every month. This allows the City to monitor the sub-recipient's progress and spending on a monthly basis.

The City of Round Rock Office of Community Development maintains an open door policy for all agencies and frequent unofficial visits are made at participating agencies throughout the year.

THE STATE OF TEXAS

1.01 **DEFINITIONS**

- A. Agreement means the binding legal contract between City and Vendor whereby City is obligated to buy specified services and Vendor is obligated to provide said services. The Agreement includes Vendor's discounts off catalog pricing (attached as Exhibit "A").
 - B. City means the City of Round Rock, Williamson and Travis Counties, Texas.
- C. Effective Date means the date upon which the binding signatures of both parties to this Agreement are affixed.
- D. Force Majeure means acts of God, strikes, lockouts, or other industrial disturbances, acts of the public enemy, orders of any kind from the government of the United States or the State of Texas or any civil or military authority, insurrections, riots, epidemics, landslides, lightning, earthquakes, fires, hurricanes, storms, floods, restraint of the government and the people, civil disturbances, explosions, or other causes not reasonably within the control of the party claiming such inability.
 - E. Goods mean the specified supplies, materials, commodities, or equipment.
- F. Services mean work performed to meet a demand or effort by Vendor to comply with promised delivery dates, specifications, and technical assistance specified.

2.01 EFFECTIVE DATE, TERM, PRICES FIRM

- A. This Agreement shall be effective on the date this Agreement has been signed by each party hereto, and shall remain in full force and effect unless and until it expires by operation of the term indicated herein, or is terminated or extended as provided herein.
 - B. This Agreement shall terminate November 30, 2021.
- C. City reserves the right to review the relationship with Vendor at any time, and may elect to terminate this Agreement with or without cause or may elect to continue.

3.01 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND EXHIBITS

The goods and services which are the subject matter of this Agreement are described in Exhibit "A" and, together with this Agreement, comprise the Contract Documents.

4.01 ITEMS

- A. This Agreement shall evidence the entire understanding and agreement between the parties and shall supersede any prior proposals, correspondence or discussions.
- B. Vendor shall satisfactorily provide all deliverables described in Exhibit "A" within the contract term specified. A change in the Scope of Services or any term of this

Agreement, including bonding requirements, must be negotiated and agreed to in all relevant details, and must be embodied in a valid Supplemental Agreement as described herein.

5.01 COSTS

- A. City agrees to pay for supplies during the term of this Agreement at the pricing set forth at in Exhibit "A." Vendor specifically acknowledged and agrees that City is not obligated to use or purchase any estimated annual quantity of goods. Only if, and when needed by City, the costs listed on Exhibit "A" shall be the basis of any charges collected by Vendor.
- B. The City shall be authorized to pay the Vendor an amount not-to-exceed **One Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$150,000.00)** for the term of this Agreement.

6.01 INVOICES

All invoices shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- A. Name and address of Vendor;
- B. Purchase Order Number;
- C. Description and quantity of items received or services provided; and
- D. Delivery or performance dates.

7.01 NON-APPROPRIATION AND FISCAL FUNDING

This Agreement is a commitment of City's current revenues only. It is understood and agreed that City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at the end of any City fiscal year if the governing body of City does not appropriate funds sufficient to purchase the services as determined by City's budget for the fiscal year in question. City may effect such termination by giving Vendor a written notice of termination at the end of its then current fiscal year.

8.01 PROMPT PAYMENT POLICY

In accordance with Chapter 2251, V.T.C.A., Texas Government Code, payment to Vendor will be made within thirty (30) days of the day on which City receives the performance, supplies, materials, equipment, and/or deliverables, or within thirty (30) days of the day on which the performance of services was complete, or within thirty (30) days of the day on which City receives a correct invoice for the performance and/or deliverables or services, whichever is later. Vendor may charge interest on an overdue payment at the "rate in effect" on September 1 of the fiscal year in which the payment becomes overdue, in accordance with V.T.C.A., Texas Government Code, Section 2251.025(b); however, this Policy does not apply to payments made by City in the event:

- A. There is a bona fide dispute between City and Vendor, a contractor, subcontractor or supplier about the goods delivered or the service performed that cause the payment to be late; or
- B. The terms of a federal contract, grant, regulation, or statute prevent City from making a timely payment with federal funds; or
- C. There is a bona fide dispute between Vendor and a subcontractor or between a subcontractor and its supplier about the goods delivered or the service performed that causes the payment to be late; or
- D. Invoices are not mailed to City in strict accordance with instructions, if any, on the purchase order or the Agreement or other such contractual agreement.

9.01 GRATUITIES AND BRIBES

City may, by written notice to Vendor, cancel this Agreement without liability to Vendor if it is determined by City that gratuities or bribes in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise were offered or given by Vendor or its agents or representatives to any City officer, employee or elected representative with respect to the performance of this Agreement. In addition, Vendor may be subject to penalties stated in Title 8 of the Texas Penal Code.

10.01 TAXES

City is exempt from Federal Excise and State Sales Tax; therefore, tax shall not be included in Vendor's charges.

11.01 ORDERS PLACED WITH ALTERNATE SERVICES PROVIDERS

If Vendor cannot provide the goods as specified, City reserves the right and option to obtain the products from another supplier or suppliers

14.01 RIGHT TO ASSURANCE

Whenever either party to this Agreement, in good faith, has reason to question the other party's intent to perform hereunder, then demand may be made to the other party for written assurance of the intent to perform. In the event that no written assurance is given within the reasonable time specified when demand is made, then and in that event the demanding party may treat such failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this Agreement.

15.01 DEFAULT

If Vendor abandons or defaults under this Agreement and is a cause of City purchasing the specified goods elsewhere, Vendor agrees that it may be charged the difference in cost, if any, and that it will not be considered in the re-advertisement of the service and that it may not be considered in future bids for the same type of work unless the scope of work is significantly changed.

Vendor shall be declared in default of this Agreement if it does any of the following:

- A. Fails to fully, timely and faithfully perform any of its material obligations under this Agreement;
- B. Fails to provide adequate assurance of performance under the "Right to Assurance" section herein; or
- C. Becomes insolvent or seeks relief under the bankruptcy laws of the United States.

16.01 TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION

- A. City has the right to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, for convenience and without cause, at any time upon thirty (30) days' written notice to Vendor.
- B. In the event of any default by Vendor, City has the right to terminate this Agreement for cause, upon ten (10) days' written notice to Vendor.
- C. Vendor has the right to terminate this Agreement only for cause, that being in the event of a material and substantial breach by City, or by mutual agreement to terminate evidenced in writing by and between the parties.
- D. In the event City terminates under subsections (A) or (B) of this section, the following shall apply: Upon City's delivery of the referenced notice to Vendor, Vendor shall discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed

to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders and contracts are chargeable to this Agreement. Within thirty (30) days after such notice of termination, Vendor shall submit a statement showing in detail the goods and/or services satisfactorily performed under this Agreement to the date of termination. City shall then pay Vendor that portion of the charges, if undisputed. The parties agree that Vendor is not entitled to compensation for services it would have performed under the remaining term of the Agreement except as provided herein.

17.01 INDEMNIFICATION

Vendor shall defend (at the option of City), indemnify, and hold City, its successors, assigns, officers, employees and elected officials harmless from and against all suits, actions, legal proceedings, claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses, attorney's fees, and any and all other costs or fees arising out of, or incident to, concerning or resulting from the fault of Vendor, or Vendor's agents, employees or subcontractors, in the performance of Vendor's obligations under this Agreement, no matter how, or to whom, such loss may occur. Nothing herein shall be deemed to limit the rights of City or Vendor (including, but not limited to the right to seek contribution) against any third party who may be liable for an indemnified claim.

18.01 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, CHARTER AND ORDINANCES

- A. Vendor, its agents, employees and subcontractors shall use best efforts to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Round Rock, as amended, and with all applicable rules and regulations promulgated by local, state and national boards, bureaus and agencies.
- B. In accordance with Chapter 2270, Texas Government Code, a governmental entity may not enter into a contract with a company for goods or services unless the contract contains written verification from the company that it: (1) does not boycott Israel; and (2) will not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this contract. The signatory executing this Agreement on behalf of Vendor verifies Vendor does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this Agreement.

19.01 ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION

21.01 APPLICABLE LAW; ENFORCEMENT AND VENUE

This Agreement shall be enforceable in Round Rock, Texas, and if legal action is necessary by either party with respect to the enforcement of any or all of the terms or conditions herein, exclusive venue for same shall lie in Williamson County, Texas. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws and court decisions of the State of Texas.

22.01 EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT

This document, and all appended documents, constitutes the entire Agreement between Vendor and City. This Agreement may only be amended or supplemented by mutual agreement of the parties hereto in writing, duly authorized by action of the City Manager or City Council.

23.01 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

City and Vendor hereby expressly agree that no claims or disputes between the parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement or a breach thereof shall be decided by any arbitration proceeding, including without limitation, any proceeding under the Federal Arbitration Act (9 USC Section 1-14) or any applicable state arbitration statute.

24.01 SEVERABILITY

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this Agreement. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, and the balance of this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if this Agreement did not contain the particular portion or provision held to be void. The parties further agree to amend this Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this section shall not prevent this entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this Agreement be determined void.

25.01 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Standard of Care. Vendor represents that it employs trained, experienced and competent persons to perform all of the services, responsibilities and duties specified herein and that such services, responsibilities and duties shall be performed in a manner according to generally accepted industry practices.

Time is of the Essence. Vendor understands and agrees that time is of the essence and that any failure of Vendor to fulfill obligations for each portion of this Agreement within the agreed timeframes will constitute a material breach of this Agreement. Vendor shall be fully responsible for its delays or for failures to use best efforts in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Where damage is caused to City due to Vendor's failure to perform in these circumstances, City may pursue any remedy available without waiver of any of City's additional legal rights or remedies.

Force Majeure. Neither City nor Vendor shall be deemed in violation of this Agreement if it is prevented from performing any of its obligations hereunder by reasons for which it is not responsible as defined herein. However, notice of such impediment or delay in performance must be timely given and all reasonable efforts undertaken to mitigate its effects.

Multiple Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, any one of which shall be considered an original of this document; and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument.

This Agreement is for the purchase traffic control products, supplies and equipment, and is referred to herein as the "Agreement." This Agreement is made and entered into on this the day of the month of _______, 2020, by and between the CITY OF ROUND ROCK, TEXAS, a home-rule municipality whose offices are located at 221 E. Main St, Round Rock, Texas 78664, referred to herein as the "City," and ITERIS, INC., whose offices are located at 1700 Carnegie Avenue, Suite 100, Santa Ana, California 92705, referred to herein as "Vendor." This Agreement supersedes and replaces any previous agreement between the named parties, whether oral or written, and whether or not established by custom and practice.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, City desires to purchase traffic control products, supplies and equipment; and

WHEREAS, City is a member of the Buy Board Cooperative Purchasing Program ("Buy Board") and Vendor is an approved Buy Board vendor through Buy Board Contract #608-20; and

WHEREAS, City desires to purchase certain goods from Vendor through Buy Board as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this Agreement to set forth in writing their respective rights, duties, and obligations;

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties mutually agree as follows:

1.0 **DEFINITIONS**

- A. Agreement means the binding legal contract between City and Vendor whereby City agrees to obtain specified goods and Vendor is obligated to provide specified goods. This Agreement includes any exhibits, addenda, and/or amendments thereto.
 - B. City means the City of Round Rock, Williamson and Travis Counties, Texas.
- C. Effective Date means the date upon which the binding signatures of both parties to this Agreement are affixed.
 - D. Goods mean the specified supplies, materials, commodities, or equipment.
 - E. Vendor means Iteris, Inc., or any successors or assigns.

2.0 EFFECTIVE DATE; TERM

- A. This Agreement shall be effective on the date it has been signed by both parties hereto, and shall remain in full force and effect unless and until it expires by operation of the term stated herein, or until terminated or extended as provided herein.
 - B. This Agreement shall expire on May 31, 2023.

3.0 SCOPE OF WORK

- A. The goods which are the subject matter of this Agreement are described generally in the attached Exhibit "A."
- B. This Agreement shall evidence the entire understanding and agreement between the parties and shall supersede any prior proposals, correspondence or discussions.
- C. Vendor shall satisfactorily provide all deliverables described in Exhibit "A" within the contract term specified. A change in the Scope of Services or any term of this Agreement, including bonding requirements, must be negotiated and agreed to in all relevant details, and must be embodied in a valid Supplemental Agreement as described herein.

4.0 COSTS

- A. City agrees to pay for goods during the term of this Agreement at the pricing set forth in Exhibit "A."
- B. The City shall is authorized to pay the Vendor an amount not-to-exceed Four Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$450,000.00) for the term of this Agreement.

5.0 INVOICES

All invoices shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- 1. Name and address of Vendor;
- 2. Purchase Order Number;
- 3. Description and quantity of items received; and
- 4. Delivery dates.

6.0 NON-APPROPRIATION AND FISCAL FUNDING

This Agreement is a commitment of City's current revenues only. It is understood and agreed that City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at the end of any City fiscal year if the governing body of City does not appropriate funds sufficient to purchase the services as determined by City's budget for the fiscal year in question. City may affect such termination by giving Vendor a written notice of termination at the end of its then-current fiscal year.

7.0 PROMPT PAYMENT POLICY

In accordance with Chapter 2251, V.T.C.A., Texas Government Code, any payment to be made by City to Vendor will be made within thirty (30) days of the date City receives goods under this Agreement, the date the performance of the services under this Agreement are completed, or the date City receives a correct invoice for the goods or services, whichever is later. Vendor may charge interest on an overdue payment at the "rate in effect" on September 1 of the fiscal year in which the payment becomes overdue, in accordance with V.T.C.A., Texas Government Code, Section 2251.025(b). This Prompt Payment Policy does not apply to payments made by City in the event:

- 1. There is a bona fide dispute between City and Vendor, a contractor, subcontractor, or supplier about the goods delivered or the service performed that cause the payment to be late; or
- 2. There is a bona fide dispute between Vendor and a subcontractor or between a subcontractor and its supplier about the goods delivered or the service performed that causes the payment to be late; or
- 3. The terms of a federal contract, grant, regulation, or statute prevent City from making a timely payment with federal funds; or
- 4. The invoice is not mailed to City in strict accordance with any instruction on the purchase order relating to the payment.

8.0 GRATUITIES AND BRIBES

City may, by written notice to Vendor, cancel this Agreement without liability to Vendor if it is determined by City that gratuities or bribes in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise were offered or given by Vendor or its agents or representatives to any City officer, employee or elected representative with respect to the performance of this Agreement. In addition, Vendor may be subject to penalties stated in Title 8 of the Texas Penal Code.

9.0 TAXES

City is exempt from Federal Excise and State Sales Tax; therefore, tax shall not be included in Vendor's charges.

10.0 INSURANCE

Vendor shall meet all City of Round Rock insurance requirements set forth at: http://www.roundrocktexas.gov/wp-content/uploads/2014/12/corr insurance 07.20112.pdf.

11.0 CITY'S REPRESENTATIVE

12.0 DEFAULT

If Vendor abandons or defaults under this Agreement and is a cause of City acquiring the specified goods elsewhere.

Vendor shall be declared in default of this Agreement if it does any of the following and fails to cure the issue within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice:

- A. Fails to fully, timely and faithfully perform any of its material obligations under this Agreement;
- B. Becomes insolvent or seeks relief under the bankruptcy laws of the United States, and is unable to perform its material obligations under the Agreement.

13.0 TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION

- A. In the event of any uncured default by either party, the non-defaulting party has the right to terminate the affected portions of this Agreement for cause, upon ten (10) days' written notice to the defaulting party following the cure period.
- B. In the event City terminates under this section, the following shall apply: Upon the effective date of the termination, Vendor shall discontinue performance of the affected services and will schedule the removal of the affected equipment. The City will be responsible only for amounts due and owing for the terminated affected services and affected equipment up through the date of termination.

14.0 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, CHARTER AND ORDINANCES

- A. Vendor, its agents, employees and subcontractors shall use best efforts to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Round Rock, as amended, and with all applicable rules and regulations promulgated by local, state and national boards, bureaus and agencies.
- B. In accordance with Chapter 2270, Texas Government Code, a governmental entity may not enter into a contract with a company for goods or services unless the contract contains written verification from the company that it: (1) does not boycott Israel; and (2) will not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this contract. The signatory executing this Agreement on behalf of Vendor verifies Vendor does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this Agreement.

15.0 ASSIGNMENT AND DELEGATION

The parties hereby bind themselves, their successors, assigns and legal representatives to each other with respect to the terms of this Agreement. Neither party shall assign, sublet or transfer any interest in this Agreement without prior written authorization of the other party.

16.0 NOTICES

- A. All notices and other communications in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be considered given as follows:
 - 1. When delivered personally to recipient's address as stated in this Agreement; or
 - 2. Three (3) days after being deposited in the United States mail, with postage prepaid to the recipient's address as stated in this Agreement.

B. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications between representatives of City and Vendor.

17.0 APPLICABLE LAW; ENFORCEMENT AND VENUE

This Agreement shall be enforceable in Round Rock, Texas, and if legal action is necessary by either party with respect to the enforcement of any or all of the terms or conditions herein, exclusive venue for same shall lie in Williamson County, Texas. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws and court decisions of the State of Texas.

18.0 EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT

This document, and all appended documents, constitutes the entire Agreement between Vendor and City. This Agreement may only be amended or supplemented by mutual agreement of the parties hereto in writing.

19.0 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

City and Vendor hereby expressly agree that no claims or disputes between the parties arising out of or relating to this Agreement or a breach thereof shall be decided by any arbitration proceeding, including without limitation, any proceeding under the Federal Arbitration Act (9 USC Section 1-14) or any applicable state arbitration statute.

20.0 SEVERABILITY

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this Agreement. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, and the balance of this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if this Agreement did not contain the particular portion or provision held to be void. The parties further agree to amend this Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this section shall not prevent this entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this Agreement be determined void.

21.0 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. Standard of Care. Vendor represents that it employs trained, experienced and competent persons to perform all of the services, responsibilities and duties specified herein and that such services, responsibilities and duties shall be performed in a manner according to generally accepted industry practices.
- B. Time is of the Essence. The parties agree that, from time to time, certain unique transactions may have special requirements relative to timing and, accordingly, the parties will identify those transactions and exercise best efforts to accomplish those transactions within the stated time frame. Other timing requirements will be met in a commercially reasonable manner. Where damage is caused to City due to Vendor's failure to perform in the special timing requirement circumstances, City may pursue any remedy available without waiver of any of City's additional legal rights or remedies.
- C. Binding Agreement. This Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties' respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.
- **D.** Multiple Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, any one of which shall be considered an original of this document; and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument.

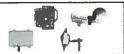

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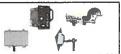

THAT THIS AGREEMENT for the purchase of fuel card with related fuel management, transaction, and payment settlement/processing services for the City of Round Rock's Fleet Department, and for related goods and services (referred to herein as the "Agreement"), is made and entered into on this the _____ day of the month of ______, 2020 by and between the CITY OF ROUND ROCK, a Texas home-rule municipality, whose offices are located at 221 East Main Street, Round Rock, Texas 78664-5299 (referred to herein as the "City"), and WEX BANK, a Utah industrial bank whose offices are located at 7090 South Union Park Center, Suite 350, Midvale, UT 84047 (referred to herein as "Vendor").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, City has been a customer of Vendor since May 11, 2012 pursuant to an Addendum to the Fuel Card Services Agreement between Wright Express Financial Services Corporation, now known as WEX Bank, and the National Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA), now known as Sourcewell, for certain goods and services, specifically fuel card with related fuel management, transaction, and payment settlement/processing services for the City's Fleet Department; and

WHEREAS, City is a member of the Sourcewell Cooperative (f/k/a National Joint Powers Alliance), a cooperative purchasing program; and

WHEREAS, Vendor is an approved vendor of the Sourcewell Cooperative; and

WHEREAS, City desires to continue to purchase certain goods and services from Vendor through Sourcewell Cooperative Contract No. 042016-WEX (the "Sourcewell Contract") as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this Agreement to set forth in writing their respective rights, duties, and obligations;

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency and receipt of which are hereby acknowledged, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follow:

1.01 EFFECTIVE DATE, TERM

- A. This Agreement shall be effective on the date this Agreement has been signed by each party hereto, and shall remain in full force and effect unless and until it expires by operation of the term indicated herein, or is terminated or extended as provided herein.
 - B. This Agreement shall terminate July 20, 2021.
- C. City reserves the right to review the relationship with Vendor at any time, and may elect to terminate this Agreement with or without cause or may elect to continue.

2.01 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND EXHIBITS

The goods and services which are the subject matter of this Agreement are described in Exhibit "A" and, together with the Sourcewell Contract, the Addendum to the Sourcewell Cooperative Contract No. 042016-WEX (the "Addendum"), attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein, and this Agreement, comprise the Contract Documents. Any inconsistencies or conflicts in the Contract Documents shall be resolved by giving preference to the Sourcewell Contract and the Addendum to the Sourcewell Cooperative Contract No. 042016-WEX. For the avoidance of doubt and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, the City acknowledges and agrees that the terms of this Agreement shall apply as between the City and WEX only to the extent (a) relevant and applicable to the nature and scope of services being provided under the Sourcewell Contract and the Addendum and (b) not contrary to or in conflict with the terms set forth in the Sourcewell Contract or in the Addendum.

3.01 ITEMS

- A. The goods and services which are the subject matter of this Agreement are described generally in the attached Exhibit "A" (Vendor's Response to Request for Proposal), incorporated herein by reference for al purposes.
- B. This Agreement shall evidence the entire understanding and agreement between the parties and shall supersede any prior proposals, correspondence or discussions.
- C. Vendor shall satisfactorily provide all deliverables described in Exhibit "A" within the contract term specified. A change in the Scope of Services or any term of this Agreement must be negotiated and agreed to in all relevant details, and must be embodied in a valid Supplemental Agreement as described herein.

4.01 NON-APPROPRIATION AND FISCAL FUNDING

This Agreement is a commitment of City's current revenues only. It is understood and agreed that City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at the end of any City fiscal year if the governing body of City does not appropriate funds sufficient to purchase the services as determined by City's budget for the fiscal year in question. City may effect such termination by giving Vendor a written notice of termination at the end of its then current fiscal year.

5.01 PROMPT PAYMENT POLICY

In accordance with Chapter 2251, V.T.C.A., Texas Government Code, payment to Vendor will be made within thirty (30) days of the day on which City receives the performance, supplies, materials, equipment, and/or deliverables, or within thirty (30) days of the day on which the performance of services was complete, or within thirty (30) days of the day on which City receives a correct invoice for the performance and/or deliverables or services, whichever is later. Vendor may charge interest on an overdue payment at the "rate in effect" on September 1 of the fiscal year in which the payment becomes overdue, in accordance with V.T.C.A., Texas Government Code, Section 2251.025(b); however, this Policy does not apply to payments made by City in the event:

- A. There is a bona fide dispute between City and Vendor, a contractor, subcontractor or supplier about the goods delivered or the service performed that cause the payment to be late; or
- B. The terms of a federal contract, grant, regulation, or statute prevent City from making a timely payment with federal funds; or
- C. There is a bona fide dispute between Vendor and a subcontractor or between a subcontractor and its supplier about the goods delivered or the service performed that causes the payment to be late; or
- D. Invoices are not mailed to City in strict accordance with instructions, if any, on the purchase order or the Agreement or other such contractual agreement.

6.01 GRATUITIES AND BRIBES

City may, by written notice to Vendor, cancel this Agreement without liability to Vendor if it is determined by City that gratuities or bribes in the form of entertainment, gifts, or otherwise were offered or given by Vendor or its agents or representatives to any City officer, employee or elected representative with respect to the performance of this Agreement. 7.01 TAXES

If Vendor cannot provide the goods or services as specified, City reserves the right and option to obtain the products from another supplier or suppliers.

Vendor shall meet all City of Round Rock Insurance Requirements attached hereto as Exhibit "C".

11.01 RIGHT TO ASSURANCE

Whenever either party to this Agreement, in good faith, has reason to question the other party's intent to perform hereunder, then demand may be made to the other party for written assurance of the intent to perform. In the event that no written assurance is given within the reasonable time specified when demand is made, then and in that event the demanding party may treat such failure as an anticipatory repudiation of this Agreement.

12.01 TERMINATION AND SUSPENSION

- A. City has the right to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, for convenience and without cause, at any time upon thirty (30) days' written notice to Vendor.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws and court decisions of the State of Texas), provided that the parties agree and acknowledge that the loans under the Agreement are made by Issuer in Utah pursuant to Utah law.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This Economic Development Program Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this ____ day of _____, 2020, (the "Effective Date") by and between the Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation, a Type B corporation ("TEDCO") created under the authority of Chapters 501 and 505, Texas Local Government Code, (the "Code") and Investex II, LLC, a Texas limited liability company ("Investex"). The foregoing are referred to collectively as the "Parties".

WHEREAS, TEDCO has adopted a resolution approving the Project (defined below) and authorizing the President to enter into this Agreement with Investex in recognition of the creation of primary jobs and the positive economic benefits to the City of Round Rock (the "City") as set forth below; and

WHEREAS, it is Investex's intention to construct a cold storage and manufacturing facility (the "Facility") containing at least 125,000 square feet and to create 60 primary jobs over five years (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to promote economic development as contemplated by Chapters 501 and 505 of the Texas Local Government Code whereby Investex intends to complete the Project; and

WHEREAS, TEDCO agrees to provide performance-based Economic Incentive Payments ("EIP's") (as defined below);

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and promises and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, TEDCO and Investex agree as follows:

1. Authority. TEDCO's execution of this Agreement is authorized by §505.102 of the Texas Local Government Code. TEDCO acknowledges that Investex is acting in reliance upon TEDCO's performance of its obligations under this Agreement in making its decision to commit substantial resources and money to lease, improve, and occupy the Facility and create primary jobs.

2. Definitions.

- 2.1. "City" means the City of Round Rock, Texas.
- 2.2 "Economic Incentive Payment(s)" ("EIPs") means the amount paid by TEDCO to Investex as set forth in Sec. 5.1.
- 2.3 "Effective Date" is the date set forth above in the introductory paragraph.
- 2.4 "Facility" means the cold storage and manufacturing building containing at least 125,000 square feet to be located on CORRIDOR PARK I, a Resub of Remainder of Lot 1, Lot 2, containing 10.663 acres at 16400 Bratton Lane, Austin, Texas.

- 2.5 "Full Time Equivalent Employee" ("FTE") means a combination of employees, each of whom individually is not a full-time employee because they are not employed on average at least 40 hours per week, but who, in combination, are counted as the equivalent of a full-time employee. FTE's shall include original hires or their replacements over time.
- 2.6 "**Primary Job**" means a job that meets the definition in §501.002(12) of the Texas Local Government Code.
- 2.7 **"Recapture Liability"** means the total amount of all EIP's that are paid as result of this Agreement that are subject to recapture by TEDCO from Investex in the event of an Investex default.
- 3 **Term**. This Agreement shall become enforceable upon its Effective Date and shall terminate on December 31, of Year 5.

4 Rights and Obligations of Investex.

- 4.1 Construction. Investex intends to construct the Facility on or before August 1, 2021.
- 4.2 <u>Investment</u>. Investex intends to invest at least \$14,000,000 in purchasing real property and constructing the Facility. Investex agrees to provide TEDCO with documentation that shows proof that this obligation has been satisfied, and TEDCO shall have the right to audit Investex's records to verify same.
- 4.3 <u>Jobs</u>. Investex agrees to create at least 60 Primary Jobs and hire a like number of full-time employees and/or FTE's, within five years of occupying the Facility, in accordance with the schedule set forth below. "Year 1" shall mean the calendar year following Investex's occupancy of the Facility.

- 4.4 <u>Job Compliance Affidavit</u>. On or before March 1 following each calendar year of this Agreement, Investex agrees to provide to TEDCO a Job Compliance Affidavit, a copy of such Job Compliance Affidavit being attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. TEDCO shall have the right, following reasonable advance notice to Investex, to audit Investex's records to verify that this obligation has been satisfied.
- 4.5 <u>Compliance with regulations</u>. Investex agrees that it will comply with the City's development approval processes, and shall construct and install the improvements

- and operate the Facility consistent with City ordinances, development regulations and legal requirements.
- 4.6 <u>Clawback</u>. In the event that Investex fails to comply with any of the actions as described in Section 4.1 through 4.5 above, Investex will immediately pay to TEDCO an amount equal to, but not to exceed, the Recapture Liability.
- **Economic Incentive Payments**. In consideration of Investex's compliance with this Agreement, TEDCO agrees as follows:
 - 5.1 <u>Schedule for EIPs</u>. TEDCO shall, subject to Investex's satisfaction of its obligations set forth herein, make EIPs to Investex as set forth herein. The EIP's shall be made in annual payments on or before April 1 of each year. "Year 1" shall be the calendar year following Investex's occupancy of the Facility. The amount of the EIP's shall be as follows:

<u>Year</u>	Amount of EIP
Year 1	\$125,000
Year 2	\$100,000
Year 3	\$ 75,000
Year 4	\$ 50,000
Year 5	\$ 25,000

- 5.2 <u>EIP Subject to Future Appropriations</u>. This Agreement shall not be construed as a commitment, issue or obligation of any specific taxes or tax revenues for payment to Investex. The EIPs by TEDCO under this Agreement are subject to the TEDCO's appropriation of funds for such payments in the budget year for which they are made. The EIPs to be made to Investex, if paid, shall be made solely from annual appropriations from the general funds of TEDCO under applicable Texas law, subject to any applicable limitations or procedural requirements. In the event that TEDCO does not appropriate funds in any fiscal year for the EIP due under this Agreement, such failure shall not be considered a default under Section 6.3, and TEDCO shall not be liable to Investex for such EIP, however, TEDCO shall extend this Agreement for another year(s), until Investex has received all of the EIPs provided for herein. In addition, Investex shall have the right but not the obligation to rescind this Agreement. To the extent there is a conflict between this paragraph and any other language or covenant in this Agreement, this paragraph shall control.
- 5.3 <u>EIP Recapture</u>. In the event TEDCO terminates this Agreement as a result of Investex's default, TEDCO may recapture and collect from Investex the Recapture Liability. Investex shall pay to TEDCO the Recapture Liability within thirty (30) days after TEDCO makes demand for same, subject to any and all lawful offsets, settlements, deduction, or credits to which Investex may be entitled. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, such Recapture Liability shall not exceed, in the aggregate, an amount equal to all EIPs that were paid pursuant to this Agreement from the Effective Date to the date of termination (together with interest

thereon to be charged at the statutory rate for delinquent taxes as determined by Section 33.01 of the Property Tax Code of the State of Texas, but without the addition of a penalty). TEDCO shall have all remedies for the collection of the Recapture Liability as provided generally in the Tax Code for the collection of delinquent property taxes.

6. Miscellaneous.

- 6.1. <u>Mutual Assistance</u>. TEDCO and Investex will do all things reasonably necessary or appropriate to carry out the terms and provisions of this Agreement.
- 6.2. Representations and Warranties. TEDCO represents and warrants to Investex that this Agreement is within its authority, and that it is duly authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement, unless otherwise ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction. Investex represents and warrants to TEDCO that it has the requisite authority to enter into this Agreement.
- 6.3. <u>Default</u>. If either TEDCO or Investex should default in the performance of any obligations of this Agreement, the other party shall provide such defaulting party with notice of such default, and a reasonable opportunity to cure such default, prior to instituting an action for breach or pursuing any other remedy for default. If TEDCO remains in default after notice and opportunity to cure, Investex shall have the right to pursue any remedy at law or in equity for TEDCO's breach. If Investex remains in default after notice and opportunity to cure, TEDCO shall have the right to pursue any remedy at law or in equity for Investex's breach.
- 6.4. <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. In the event any legal action or proceeding is commenced in a court of competent jurisdiction between TEDCO and Investex to enforce provisions of this Agreement and recover damages for breach, the prevailing party in such legal action shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorney's fees and expenses incurred by reason of such action, to the extent allowed by law.
- 6.5. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties. This Agreement may only be amended, altered or revoked by written instrument signed by TEDCO and Investex.
- 6.6. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties, their respective successors and assigns.
- 6.7. <u>Assignment</u>. Investex may not assign all or part of its rights and obligations to a third party without the express written consent of TEDCO, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed, provided, however, that this Agreement may be assigned by either party without the consent of the other to an affiliate or to any third party who succeeds to substantially all of its business or assets.
- 6.8. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended by the mutual written agreement of the parties.

- 6.9. <u>Termination</u>. In the event Investex elects not to construct the Facility as contemplated by this Agreement, Investex shall notify TEDCO in writing, and this Agreement and the obligations on the part of both parties shall be deemed terminated and of no further force or effect.
- 6.10. Notice. Any notice and or statement required and permitted to be delivered shall be deemed delivered by actual delivery, facsimile with receipt of confirmation, or by depositing the same in the United States mail, certified with return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed to the appropriate party at the following addresses:

- Either party may designate a different address at any time upon written notice to the other party.
- 6.11. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement is made, and shall be construed and interpreted, under the laws of the State of Texas and venue shall lie in Williamson County, Texas.
- 6.12. Severability. In the event any provisions of this Agreement are illegal, invalid or unenforceable under present or future laws, and in that event, it is the intention of the parties that the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected. It is also the intention of the parties of this Agreement that in lieu of each clause and provision that is found to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, a provision be added to this Agreement which is legal, valid or enforceable and is as similar in terms as possible to the provision found to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable.
- 6.13. <u>Paragraph Headings</u>. The paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for convenience only and will in no way enlarge or limit the scope or meaning of the various and several paragraphs.
- 6.14. No Third-Party Beneficiaries. This Agreement is not intended to confer any rights, privileges or causes of action upon any third party.
- 6.15. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Except as otherwise provided herein, an equitable adjustment shall be made for delay or failure in performing if such delay or failure is caused, prevented, or restricted by conditions beyond that Party's reasonable control (a "force majeure event"). A force majeure event for the purposes of this Agreement shall include, but not be limited to, acts of God, fire; explosion, vandalism; Pandemic Measures; storm or similar occurrences; orders or acts of military or civil authority; litigation; changes in law, rules, or regulations outside the control of the affected Party; national emergencies or insurrections; riots; acts of terrorism; or supplier failures, shortages or breach or delay. Except as otherwise expressly provided, herein, there shall be an equitable adjustment allowed for performance under this Agreement as the result of any event of force majeure.
- 6.16. "Pandemic Measures" means any quarantine, cordon sanitaire, "shelter in place," work shut down order, non-essential business designation, occupancy or spacing limitation, protective or cleaning measures, or any other valid law, ordinance or regulation issued in response to a pandemic, or an epidemic occurring in the vicinity of the Project, by a governmental entity with jurisdiction over the Project or the Work, and which hinders or delays a Party's ability to satisfy an obligation of this Agreement.
- 6.17. No Joint Venture. It is acknowledged and agreed by the parties that the terms hereof are not intended to and shall not be deemed to create any partnership or joint venture among the parties. TEDCO, its past, present and future officers, elected officials, employees and agents of the City, do not assume any responsibilities or liabilities

to any third party in connection with the development of the Facility or the design, construction or operation of any portion of the Facility.

6.18. Estoppel Certificate. Investex may request an estoppel certificate from TEDCO so long as the certificate is requested in connection with a bona fide business purpose and requests commercially reasonable certifications. TEDCO agrees to promptly execute and deliver any estoppel certificate reasonably requested pursuant to this Section 6.18. The certificate, which will upon request be addressed to Investex, or a lessee, purchaser or assignee of Investex, shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, statements (qualified to the best knowledge of TEDCO) that this Agreement is in full force and effect without default (or if a default exists, the nature of such default and any curative action which should be undertaken to cure same), the remaining term of this Agreement, and such other matters reasonably requested by the party(ies) to receive the certificate.

A five-year project spending plan will be presented and adopted at least annually to ensure adequate funds are available for transportation, economic development and other allowed uses of Type B funds. This five-year plan will be reviewed by staff at least quarterly and updates will be presented to the Type B board as needed for transportation capital improvements programs (TCIP), economic incentive programs (EIP) and other legally allowable projects approved by the Type B board and by Council. The initial plan was brought before the Type B Board on January 24, 2019 with the most recent update brought before the Board on July 25, 2019. This agenda item is to approve the adoption of this plan by the Type B Board at the July 23, 2020 meeting. The Type B Funds Allocation Plan is attached. The \$308.3 million five-year plan allocates \$264.1 million to committed and planned Transportation Projects and \$44.2 million to Economic Development projects and incentives. This plan includes the costs of projects that will be funded by the Transportation Certificates of Obligation (C.O.), beginning with the first two of the five planned debt issues with \$30M in May 2019 and \$30M in May 2020. This plan will be reviewed and updated at least annually as part of the budget process; significant changes in project needs may require more frequent updates.

To approve the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO), Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) and the City of Round Rock, in accordance with regulations 23 CFR 450.314.

Per MAP-21 and the FAST Act, federal regulations require a written agreement between the MPO, State DOT and public transit providers to clearly identify in a written agreement their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan planning process.

This agreement includes specific provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to the development of financial plans, performance data, performance targets and the reporting and tracking progress.

RESOLUTION NO. R-2020-0199

WHEREAS, the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act ("FAST Act") requires the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization ("MPO") and the City of Round Rock ("City") to cooperatively determine their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process as set forth in 23 CFR 450.314; and

WHEREAS, the MPO, State Department of Transportation ("DOT"), and the City, as the public transit provider, shall jointly agree upon and develop specific written procedures for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the selection of performance targets, the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO, and the collection of data for the State asset management plan for the National Highway System; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the MPO and State DOT to outline and identify their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process, Now Therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROUND ROCK, TEXAS,

That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the City a Memorandum of Understanding with the Capital Metropolitan Planning Organization and the State Department of Transportation, a copy of same being attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

AMONG

THE CAPITAL AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO) TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION CITY OF ROUND ROCK

WHEREAS, the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act) promulgated regulations 23 CFR 450.314, and

WHEREAS, the MPO and the City of Round Rock are required by 23 CFR 450.314 to cooperatively determine their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process, and

WHEREAS, these responsibilities shall be clearly identified in written agreements among the MPO and the City of Round Rock (Transit Provider), and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations require the written agreement to include specific provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to the development of financial plans that support the metropolitan transportation plan (MTP), the metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program ("TIP"), and development of the annual listing of obligated projects.

WHEREAS, the MPO and the designated air quality planning agency entered into a written agreement on May 12, 1978, followed by a letter from the Governor of Texas to the United States Environmental Protection Agency dated July 24, 1978, describing their respective roles and responsibilities for air quality related transportation planning. The agreement and letter were submitted as part of a revision to the State Implementation Plan that was approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency on March 29, 1982, effective May 28, 1982. The roles and responsibilities for air quality related transportation planning were subsequently codified in Title 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 114, Subchapter G Transportation Planning, which was approved into the State Implementation Plan on November 8, 1995, effective January 8, 1996.

WHEREAS, the federal regulations require that the MPO, State DOT, and the public transit providers shall jointly agree upon and develop specific written procedures for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the selection of performance targets, the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO, and the collection of data for the State asset management plan for the National Highway System (NHS).

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Purpose</u>. It is the purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to make provision for cooperative mutual responsibilities in carrying out the Metropolitan Planning Process and Performance Based Planning and Programming in the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Area and to provide an agreement between the State of Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), the City of Round Rock, in accordance with current Federal Legislation and as required by 23 CFR 450.314.

2 <u>Responsibilities of all parties</u>. All parties will:

- a. Cooperatively determine their mutual responsibilities in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process in a performance-based planning format and final form. Decide upon and adopt performance targets for this planning process in accordance with Federal and State requirements and guidance.
- b. Make provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to the development of financial plans that support the Metropolitan Transportation Plan ("MTP") and TIP.
- c. Ensure TxDOT, the Public Transportation Operator(s) and the MPO cooperatively develop a listing of projects that comprehensively address the transportation system within the MPO boundaries. Identified projects shall include both roadway and transit initiatives, including but not limited to investments in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities for which federal funds were obligated in the preceding fiscal year.
- d. Ensure that the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) will detail and document these responsibilities, deliverables and associated costs.

3. Performance Based Planning & Programming

- a. Developing transportation performance data
 - i. TxDOT will provide the MPO with a subset for their MPA of the state performance data used in developing statewide targets.
 - ii. If an MPO chooses to develop their own target for any measure, they will provide TxDOT with any supplemental data they utilize in association with the target-setting process.

b. Selection of transportation performance targets

- i. TxDOT will develop draft statewide federal performance targets in coordination with the applicable MPOs. Coordination may include inperson meetings, web meetings, conference calls, and/or email communication. MPOs shall be given an opportunity to provide comments on statewide targets one month prior to final statewide targets adoption.
- ii. If the MPO chooses to adopt their own target for any measure, it will develop draft MPO performance targets in coordination with TxDOT. Coordination methods will be at the discretion of the MPO, but TxDOT shall be provided an opportunity to provide comments on draft MPO performance targets prior to final approval.

c. Reporting of performance targets

- i. TxDOT performance targets will be reported to FHWA and FTA, as applicable. The MPO will be notified when TxDOT has reported final statewide targets.
- ii. MPO performance targets will be reported to TxDOT.

For each target, the MPO will provide the following information no later than 180 days after the date TxDOT or the Public Transportation Operator establishes performance targets, or the date specified by federal code:

- a. Written agreement to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of TxDOT or Public Transportation Operator performance target, or;
- b. Written notification that the MPO will set a quantifiable target for that performance measure for the MPO's planning area.
 - i. If a quantifiable target is set for the MPO planning area, the MPO will provide any supplemental data used in determining any such target.
- c. Documentation of the MPO's target or support of the statewide or relevant public transportation provider target will be provided in the form of a resolution or meeting minutes.

- iii. TxDOT will include information outlined in 23 CFR 450.216 (f) in any statewide transportation plan amended or adopted after May 27, 2018, and information outlined in 23 CFR 450.218 (q) in any statewide transportation improvement program amended or adopted after May 27, 2018.
- iv. The MPO will include information outlined in 23 CFR 450.324 (g) (3-4) in any MTP amended or adopted after May 27, 2018, and information outlined in 23 CFR 450.326 (d) in any TIP amended or adopted after May 27, 2018.
- v. Reporting of targets and performance by TxDOT and the MPO shall conform to 23 CFR 490, 49 CFR 625, and 49 CFR 673
- d. Reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region of the MPO
 - i. TxDOT will provide the MPO with an update of the subset for their MPA of the state performance data used in developing statewide targets including prior performance data.
- e. The collection of data for the State asset management plans for the NHS
 - i. TxDOT will be responsible for collecting bridge and pavement condition data for the State asset management plan for the NHS.

4. Responsibilities of the MPO

The MPO will:

- a. Work in consultation with the Transportation Policy Board that includes the City of Round Rock as a voting member and TxDOT in developing the financial plan for the MTP.
- b. Work in consultation with the Transportation Policy Board that includes the City of Round Rock as a voting member and TxDOT in developing the financial plan for the TIP.
- c. Conduct Technical Committee and Policy Board meetings as required and necessary.

- d. In consultation with the Transportation Policy Board that includes the City of Round Rock as a voting member and TxDOT, update the MTP and TIP in accordance with State and Federal laws.
- e. Invite the City of Round Rock to participate in all public participation processes.
- f. Conduct comprehensive, cooperative and continuous transportation planning for the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization.
- g. Establish necessary transportation performance targets, share information related to the performance data, and document the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes within the MPO MPA, if the MPO elects to develop quantifiable targets for performance measures for the MPO's planning area.
- h. Solicit public participation and input into the development of the long-range plan and the TIP.

5. Responsibilities of the Public Transportation Operator(s)

In its role as the City of Round Rock and a voting member on the Transportation Policy Board and the Technical Advisory Committee, the Public Transportation Operator(s) will:

- a. Work in consultation with the MPO in developing short-range and long-range plans for transit for inclusion in the MTP.
- b. Assist in validation of data used as input into the transportation plan.
- c. Work in consultation with the MPO and TxDOT in developing the financial plan for the MTP.
- d. Work in consultation with the MPO and TXDOT in developing the financial plan for the TIP.
- e. Provide the MPO with the annual list of transit obligated projects.
- f. Serve on the MPO Technical Committee and Policy Board as applicable.
- g. Notify the MPO of changes to projects that would affect the MTP or TIP.
- h. Invite the MPO to participate in all public participation processes.

i. Establish transit asset management performance targets and share with the MPO and other interested parties.

6. Responsibilities of TxDOT.

- a. Work in consultation with Public Transportation Operator(s) and the MPO in developing the financial plan for the TIP and MTP.
- b. Assist in the validation of data used as input into the transportation plan.
- c. Provide the MPO with the annual list of obligated projects.
- d. Serve on the MPO Technical Committee and Policy Board.
- e. Notify the MPO of changes to projects that would affect the MTP or TIP.
- f. In consultation with the MPO and Transit District, update the MTP and TIP in accordance with State and Federal laws.
- g. Work in consultation with the MPO and Public Transportation Operator(s) in developing short-range and long-range plans for transit for inclusion in the MTP and TIP.
- 7. <u>Term</u>. This Memorandum shall become effective as to each Party when fully executed by all parties. It shall remain in full force and effect until such time it is terminated in writing by one or all the parties.
- 8. Validity and Enforceability. If any current or future legal limitations affect the validity or enforceability of a provision of this MOU, then the legal limitations are made a part of this MOU and shall operate to amend this MOU to the minimum extent necessary to bring this MOU into conformity with the requirements of the limitations, and so modified, this MOU shall continue in full force and effect.
- 9. Governing Law and Venue. This MOU shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for an action arising under this MOU shall lie exclusively in Travis County, Texas.
- 10. <u>Severability</u>. If a provision contained in this MOU is held invalid for any reason, the invalidity does not affect other provisions of the MOU and can be given effect without the

invalid provision, and to this end the provisions of this MOU are severable.

Text of Legislative File 2020-0200

The City of Round Rock owns a raw water pump station on Lake Georgetown, which supplies water to the City's water treatment plant. Invasive zebra mussels have recently been detected in Lake Georgetown and on the intake structure of the raw water pump station. Zebra mussels have a long history of attaching in massive quantities to raw water intakes, thereby damaging the infrastructure and restricting flow to the facility.

The purpose of this project is to replace our raw water intake screens with copper alloy screens, which are zebra muscle resistant. The new screens will require minimal maintenance and are less susceptible to clogging due to zebra mussels. The Brushy Creek Municipal Utility District (MUD) also owns and operates a raw water intake directly adjacent to the City of Round Rock's raw water intake. Brushy Creek MUD desires to replace its raw water intake screens with copper alloy screens similar to the City's. The City will manage the construction for both entities based on the Interlocal Agreement (ILA) that was approved by the City Council on May 14, 2020.

The Utilities and Environmental Services (U&ES) Department opened bids for the project on June 9, 2020. The property at 16400 Bratton Lane is in the process of developing and wishes to receive water and wastewater service from the City of Round Rock. The water and wastewater Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) which is managed by the Public Utility Commission (PUC) determines who has the designated authority to provide utility service to a property in Texas.

Both the City of Austin and City of Round Rock water and wastewater CCN's extend onto a portion of this property. WATER SERVICE AREA TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This WATER SERVICE AREA TRANSFER AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Austin, Texas, a home rule municipality organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas ("Austin"), and the City of Round Rock, Texas, a home rule municipality organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas ("Round Rock"), as of the date this Agreement is fully executed by the last party to sign the Agreement (the "Effective Date"). Austin and Round Rock are each a "Party" to this Agreement, and collectively they are the "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Round Rock is the holder of <u>sewer</u> Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("*CCN*") No. 20421, the boundaries of which are within Travis and Williamson Counties, Texas;

WHEREAS, Round Rock is the holder of <u>water</u> CCN No. 11047, the boundaries of which are within Travis and Williamson Counties, Texas;

WHEREAS, Austin is the holder of <u>sewer</u> CCN No. 20636, the boundaries of which are within Travis, Hays, Bastrop, and Williamson Counties, Texas;

WHEREAS, Austin is the holder of <u>water</u> CCN No. 11322, the boundaries of which are within Travis, Hays, Bastrop, and Williamson Counties, Texas;

WHEREAS, Round Rock's water and sewer CCN boundaries and Austin's water and sewer CCN boundaries are adjacent to each other in certain locations;

WHEREAS, Investex II, LLC ("Investex") is the owner of an approximately 10.66 acre tract of land located at 16400 Bratton Lane, Round Rock, Texas more specifically described as Lot 1, Corridor Park I, a subdivision in Travis County, Texas according to the map or plat thereof recorded in Volume 94, Page(s) 306-307 of the Plat Records of Travis County, Texas (the "Investex Tract");

WHEREAS, the Investex Tract is entirely within Round Rock's city limits, and the Investex Tract overlaps both Austin and Round Rock water and sewer CCNs;

WHEREAS, a small portion along the <u>north</u> end of the Investex Tract, which is more specifically described and depicted in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, is located within Round Rock's water and sewer CCNs;

WHEREAS, a small portion along the <u>south</u> end of the Investex Tract, which is more specifically described and depicted in **Exhibit A**, is located within Austin's water and sewer CCNs (the "*Transfer Tract*");

- **WHEREAS,** Round Rock intends to service the Investex Tract with water and sewer service in accordance with Round Rock's CCNs; however, the small portion of the Investex Tract also overlaps with the Austin CCNs;
- **WHEREAS,** Investex has requested that Austin release the Investex Tract from Austin's overlapping water and sewer CCN boundaries;
- **WHEREAS,** Texas Water Code ("*TWC*") § 13.248 authorizes contracts between retail public utilities designating areas and customers to be served by those retail public utilities, when approved by the Public Utility Commission of Texas (the "*PUC*") after public notice and hearing;
- WHEREAS, Austin and Round Rock wish to enter into a TWC § 13.248 agreement to transfer the Transfer Tract from Austin's CCNs to Round Rock's CCNs, which Investex will coordinate;
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** for the good and valuable consideration contained herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- **1.** <u>Purpose.</u> This Agreement shall be a "contract" designating areas and customers to be served by the Parties in accordance with TWC § 13.248.
- 2. <u>Transfer.</u> Austin transfers and conveys to Round Rock the portions of Austin's water CCN No. 11322 and the portions of Austin's sewer CCN No. 20636 that overlap with the Transfer Tract, subject to approval by the PUC. Round Rock will work through Investex to prepare, file, and advance the necessary transfer applications in accordance with the TWC for such approval by the PUC. Austin agrees to cooperate with Round Rock in advancing application(s) to the PUC to transfer such water and sewer CCN boundaries from Austin's CCNs to Round Rock's CCNs, should the need arise.
- **3.** No Continuing Obligation to Serve. The Parties agree that upon PUC approval of the application(s) to transfer the portion of Austin's water and sewer CCNs overlapping with the Transfer Tract to Round Rock, Austin shall have no further obligation to provide retail water or sewer service to the Transfer Tract.
- **4.** <u>Termination.</u> Either Party shall have the authority to terminate this Agreement for its convenience at any time before the transfer is approved by the PUC.
- 5. <u>Applicable Law and Venue.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the Constitution and the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to conflicts of laws principles which would apply the law of any other jurisdiction. Venue for

any dispute arising out of or concerning this Agreement, either administrative or judicial, shall be proper and lie exclusively in Travis County, Texas.

- **Entire Agreement.** The Agreement reflects the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, both written and oral, between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.
- 7. Notice. When this Contract requires the Parties to provide notice to each other, the notice shall be in writing. Notices must be addressed, hand-delivered, or emailed only to the person designated for receipt of notice. A mailed notice shall be considered delivered three (3) business days after postmarked if sent by U.S. Postal Service Certified or Registered Mail, Return Receipt Requested, postage prepaid. Hand-delivered notices are considered delivered only when the addressee receives those notices. Notices delivered by e-mail are considered delivered three (3) business days after transmittal or when received by the addressee, whichever is earlier. The Parties may make routine communications by first class mail, e-mail, or other commercially accepted means. Notices and routine communications to Austin and Round Rock shall be addressed as follows:

- **8.** Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall bind the Parties and their legal successors, but shall not otherwise be assignable. All of the respective obligations of each of the Parties shall bind that Party and shall apply to and bind any successors of that Party.
- **9.** Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated into this Agreement for all purposes.
- 10. <u>Multiple Originals</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be, for all purposes, deemed to be an original, and all such counterparts shall together constitute and be one and the same instrument.

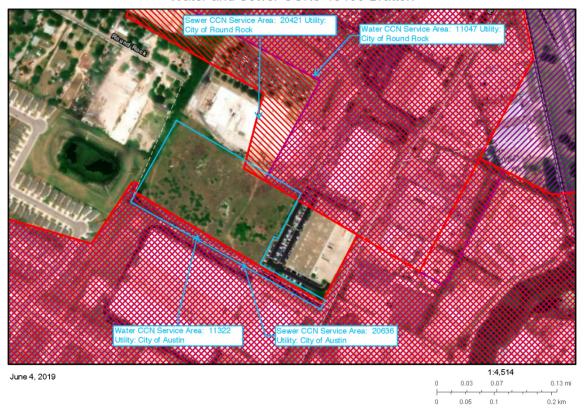

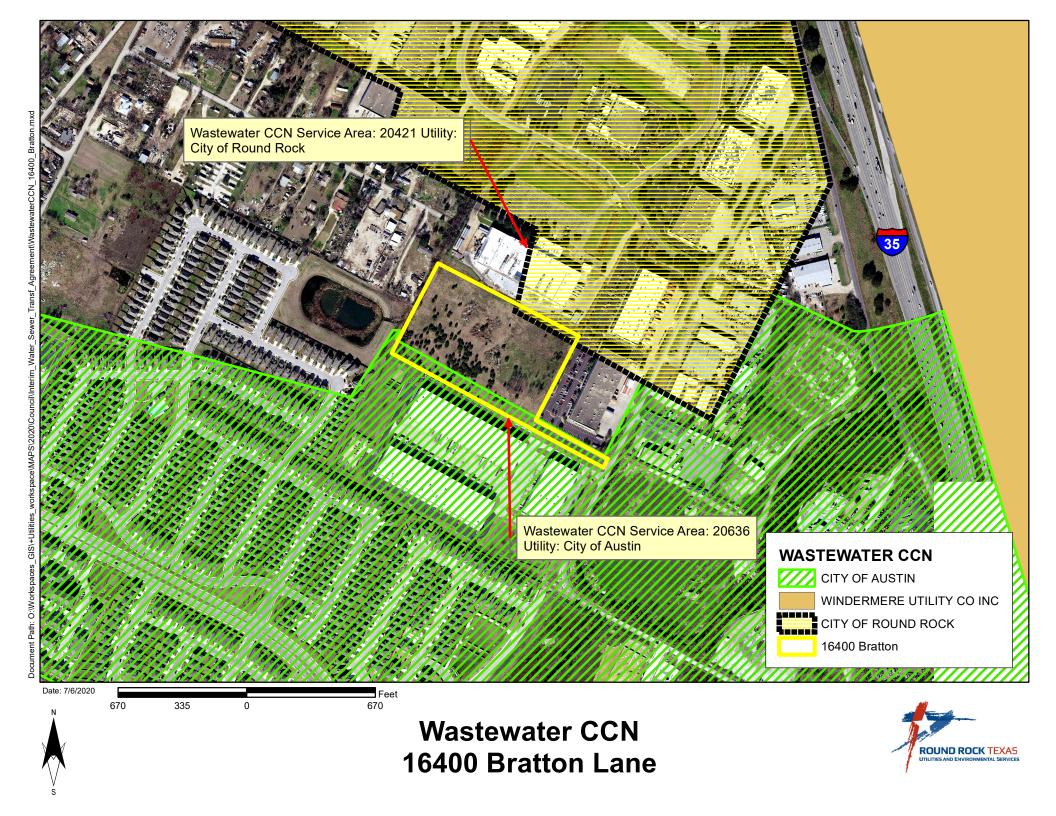

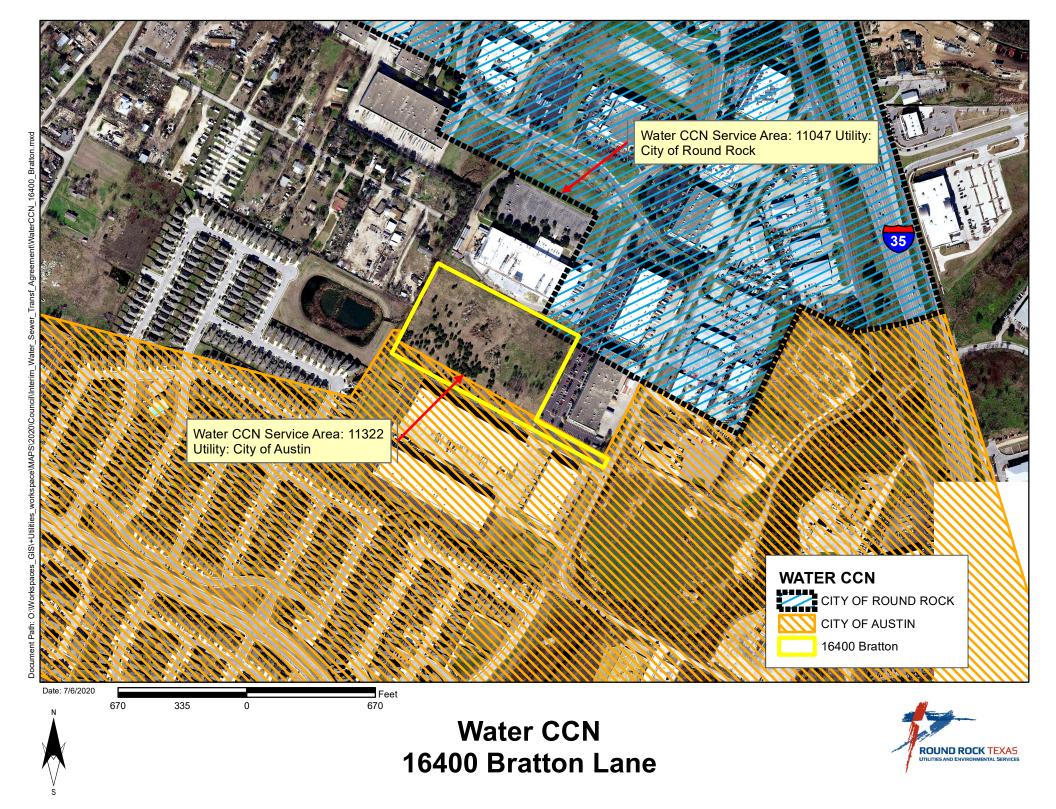

WHEREAS, Investex II, LLC ("Investex") is the owner of an approximately 10.66 acre tract of land located at 16400 Bratton Lane, Round Rock, Texas more specifically described as Lot 1, Corridor Park I, a subdivision in Travis County, Texas according to the map or plat thereof recorded in Volume 94, Page(s) 306-307 of the Plat Records of Travis County, Texas (the "Investex Tract");

WHEREAS, the Investex Tract is entirely within Round Rock's city limits, and the Investex Tract overlaps both Austin and Round Rock water and sewer CCNs;

WHEREAS, a small portion along the <u>north</u> end of the Investex Tract, which is more specifically described and depicted in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, is located within Round Rock's water and sewer CCNs;

WHEREAS, a small portion along the <u>south</u> end of the Investex Tract, which is more specifically described and depicted in **Exhibit A**, is located within Austin's water and sewer CCNs (the "*Transfer Tract*");

WHEREAS, Round Rock intends to service the Investex Tract with water and sewer service in accordance with Round Rock's CCNs; however, the small portion of the Investex Tract Interim Water & Sewer Service Transfer Agreement

also overlaps with the Austin CCNs;

WHEREAS, Investex has requested that Austin release the Investex Tract from Austin's overlapping water and sewer CCN boundaries;

WHEREAS, Austin and Round Rock intend to enter into a water and sewer area transfer agreement in accordance with Texas Water Code ("TWC") §13.248;

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to acknowledge Round Rock's service to the Investex Tract and allow Round Rock to provide and continue to provide water and sewer service to the Investex Tract;

WHEREAS, TWC § 13.248 authorizes contracts between retail public utilities designating areas and customers to be served by those retail public utilities, when approved by the Public Utility Commission of Texas (the "PUC") after public notice and hearing;

WHEREAS, Investex is in the process of coordinating a potential water and sewer service area transfer between Austin and Round Rock to officially re-designate the CCN boundaries in accordance with the TWC and PUC regulations, and;

WHEREAS, the parties intend for this Agreement to terminate upon approval by the PUC of the revised boundaries;

NOW, THEREFORE, for the good and valuable consideration contained herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. <u>Purpose.</u> This Agreement designates the customer to be provided water and sewer service by Round Rock.
- 2. <u>Interim Water Service.</u> The Parties agree that Round Rock will provide water and sewer service to the Transfer Tract. The Parties agree that this is an interim water and sewer service agreement and it will be valid until such time as the PUC officially re-designates the CCN boundaries in accordance with the TWC and PUC regulations, or until such time as either Party terminates this Agreement in accordance with Section 13.
- **3.** No Continuing Obligation to Serve. Upon termination in accordance with Section 13 of the Agreement, provided that the PUC has approved transfer of the Transfer Tract to Round Rock's CCNs, Austin shall have no further obligation to provide retail water and sewer service to the Transfer Tract.
- **4.** <u>Jurisdiction and Venue.</u> This Agreement is made under and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to conflicts of laws principles which would apply the law of any other jurisdiction. Venue for any dispute arising out of or concerning this Agreement, either administrative or judicial, shall be proper and lie exclusively in Travis County, Texas.

- **5.** Complete Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties and supersedes all previous agreements, understandings, discussions, or representations concerning its subject matter. This Agreement may not be amended in whole or in part except in a written amendment executed by both Parties to the Agreement.
- 6. Notice. When this Agreement requires the Parties to provide notice to each other, the notice shall be in writing. Notices must be addressed, hand-delivered, or emailed only to the person designated for receipt of notice. A mailed notice shall be considered delivered three (3) business days after postmarked if sent by U.S. Postal Service Certified or Registered Mail, Return Receipt Requested, postage prepaid. Hand-delivered notices are considered delivered only when the addressee receives those notices. Notices delivered by e-mail are considered delivered three (3) business days after transmittal or when received by the addressee, whichever is earlier. The Parties may make routine communications by first class mail, e-mail, or other commercially accepted means. Notices and routine communications to Austin and Round Rock shall be addressed as follows:

- 7. <u>Assignment.</u> A party to this Agreement may not assign or transfer its interests under this Agreement.
- **8.** <u>Recitals.</u> The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated into this Agreement for all purposes.
- **9.** Multiple Originals. This Agreement may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be for all purposes deemed to be an original. All such counterparts shall together constitute and be one and the same instrument.
- 10. <u>Authority.</u> The Parties represent that the individuals named below are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of their respective Party.

- 11. <u>Enforceability.</u> The Parties agree that this Agreement constitutes the legal, valid, and binding obligation of each Party hereto, enforceable in accordance with its terms, and that each Party is entering into this Agreement in reliance upon the enforceability of this Agreement.
- 12. <u>Severability.</u> If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that a term or provision of this Agreement is void or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement remains effective to the extent permitted by law.
- 13. <u>Termination.</u> Round Rock shall provide notice to Austin when the PUC approves a water service area transfer and re-designates the CCN boundaries. Investex may provide this notice on Round Rock's behalf. If the revised CCN boundaries are approved by the PUC, this Agreement will no longer be necessary, and the Agreement shall automatically terminate. If the PUC does not approve the transfer, the Parties agree to work together to ensure that the Transfer Tract continues to receive water and sewer service. If the PUC does not approve the Parties' application for a water service area transfer, either Party may terminate this Agreement by providing the other Party with at least sixty (60) days' advance notice in writing.

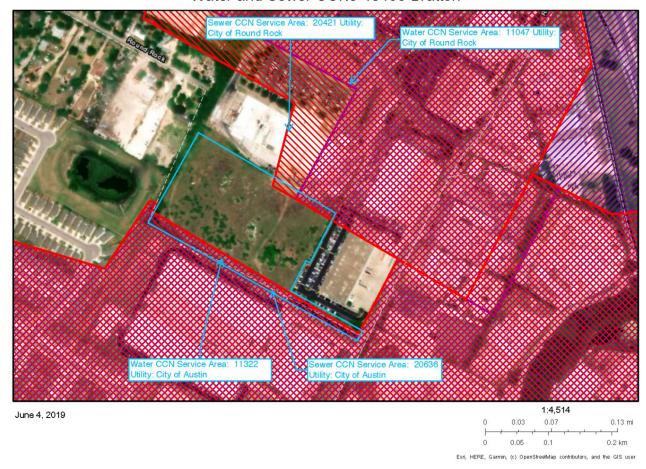
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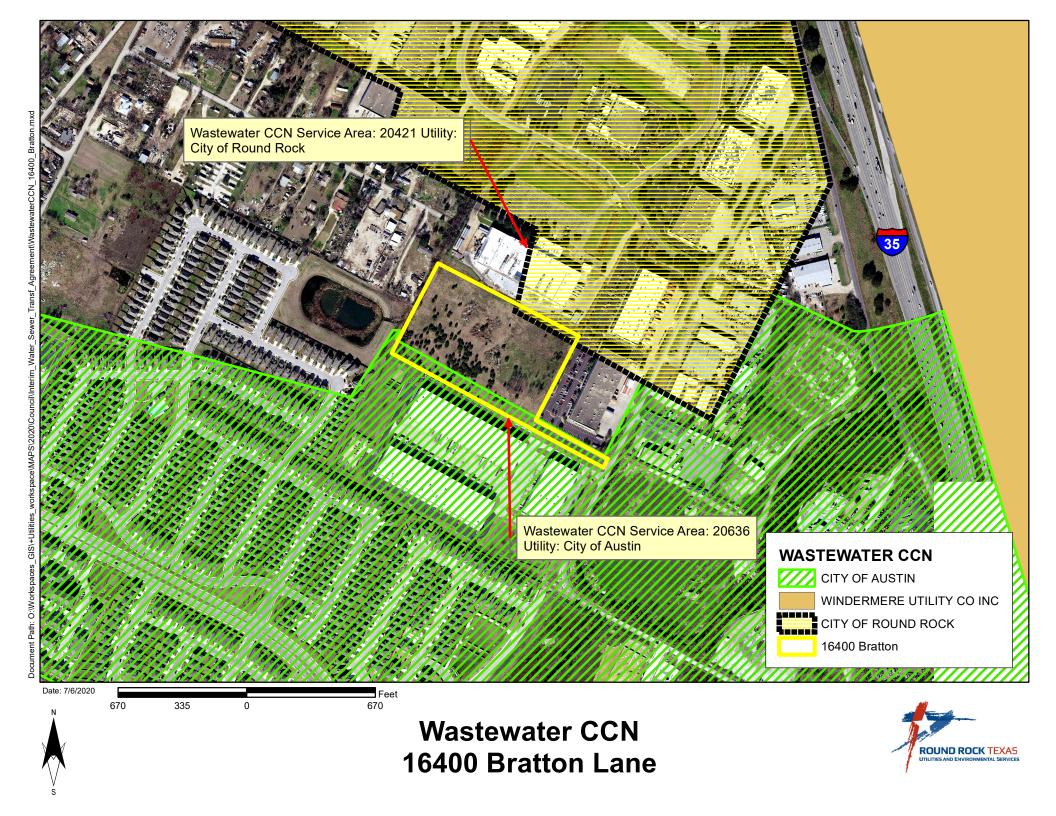

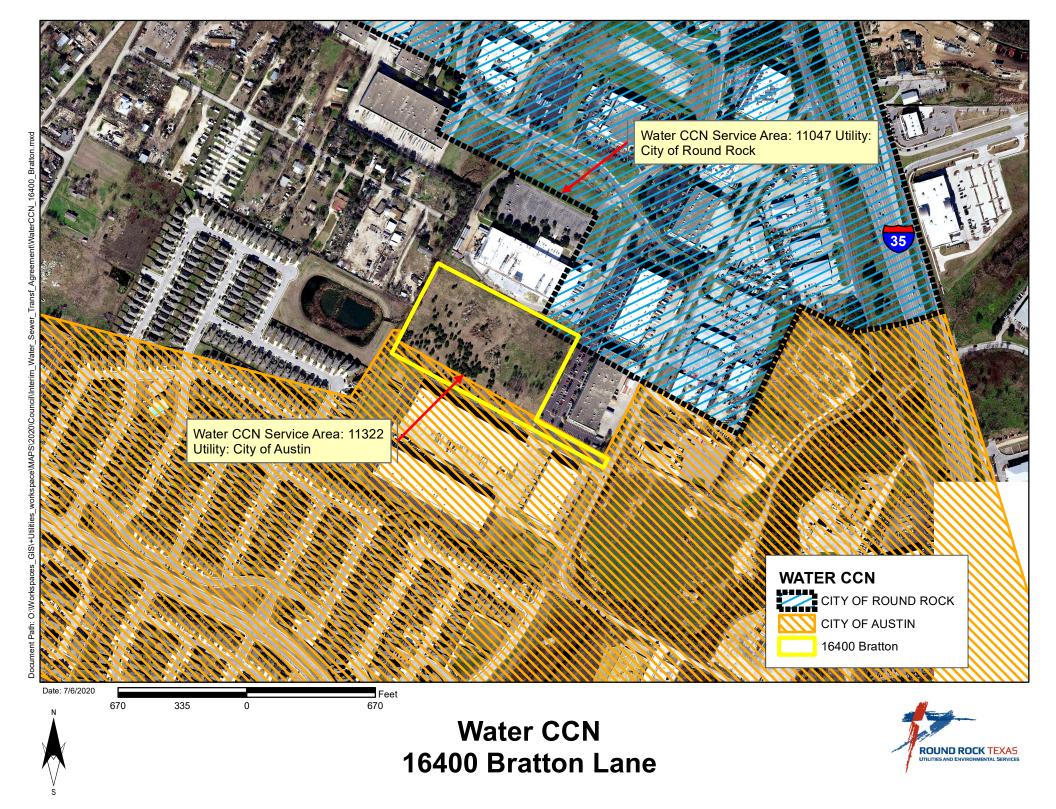

This Memorandum of Understanding, ("Memorandum") is entered into by and among the Brazos River Authority, ("BRA"), with a mailing address of 4600 Cobbs Drive, Waco, Texas 76710, the City of Georgetown ("Georgetown"), with a mailing address of 300-1 Industrial Ave., Georgetown, Texas 78626, and the City of Round Rock ("Round Rock"), with a mailing address of 221 E. Main Street, Round Rock, Texas 78664, (collectively "Participant(s)"), to be effective as of the date last executed below ("Effective Date").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the State of Texas has determined that a regional approach for planning and developing water resource projects is an effective methodology for meeting local needs and managing the state's resources;

WHEREAS, BRA was created by the Texas Legislature to manage the water resources of the Brazos River Basin;

WHEREAS, Georgetown and Round Rock desire to acquire additional water resources to meet the needs of their citizens;

WHEREAS, the State Water Plan has identified needs throughout Williamson County for additional water resource supply and public water supply infrastructure;

WHEREAS, BRA intends to pursue the development of additional water resource supplies across the Brazos River Basin and provide a framework for water supply project evaluation and prioritization that considers benefits, risk, and fiscal impact and sustainability;

WHEREAS, Participants have each been reviewing various water supply options for addressing long term water resource supply needs; and

WHEREAS, Participants have determined that a collaborative approach to water development will prove beneficial and therefore will work together to define water resource needs, identify potential developable sources of water, and projects to meet the water needs of parts or portions of Williamson County.

NOW, THEREFORE, Participants in consideration of the mutual covenants, obligations, and benefits provided herein, agree as set forth above and hereinafter:

Article I. Cooperative Understanding

1.1 Participants intend to jointly pursue a collaborative water resource development and planning project ("Project") to meet long-term water supply needs in Williamson County.

- **1.2** The Project may contain multiple phases, with the Participants determining funding levels in subsequent interlocal agreements.
- **1.3** In an effort to facilitate the contemplated long-term water development initiatives and planning efforts, the Participants shall establish a Participant Committee, which will work collaboratively to identify and implement sustainable solutions and provide regional approaches to water resource solutions in Williamson County.
- **1.4** Each Participant will appoint a representative 1) to attend all Participant Committee meetings; 2) to participate and receive information; and 3) to provide input during the preparation of the Project.

- **2.2** Timelines for Project activities will be determined and agreed to by the Participants in subsequent interlocal agreements.
- **2.3** Upon completion of the initiatives contemplated herein, the Participants agree to negotiate in good faith for the implementation of a long-term water supply solution(s). These negotiations may include further phases and/or funding for this Project.

Article III. General Provisions

- **3.1 Future Obligations.** This Memorandum does not obligate any Participant to participate in the development of any project beyond the efforts set forth herein.
- **3.2 Entire Agreement.** The terms and provisions of this Memorandum contain the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the matters addressed above.
- **3.3** Amendments. No modification, addition, deletion, revision or other change to this Memorandum shall be effective unless such change is reduced to writing and executed by all Parties.
- **3.4 Multiple Counterparts.** This Memorandum may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original.

Text of Legislative File 2020-0204

The City is required to continue our Wastewater Collection System Rehabilitation Program to comply with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone Protection Program. This program requires that the City inspect the wastewater collection systems located over the Edwards Aquifer and complete any necessary rehabilitation every five years. The elimination of defects not only helps to protect the Edwards Aquifer, but also reduces inflow and infiltration entering the City's wastewater collection system; thereby, reduces the City's wastewater treatment costs. The City has completed the inspection of four sub-basins to determine areas that require rehabilitation for this project.

The City will perform the rehabilitation work in sub-basins BC-08, BC-21, BC-22Z, and OC-24Z (Egger Acres Subdivision). The original contract for construction phase services was based on the developed construction plans and specifications to rehabilitate the wastewater collection system in a portion of these sub-basins. The project includes pipe bursting 11,390 linear feet of existing 6-inch wastewater line with 8-inch High-density Polyethylene Pipe(HDPE) wastewater line, and 3,750 linear feet of existing 8-inch wastewater line with 8-inch HDPE wastewater line.

Additional defects were found in the wastewater collection system near the project area. Therefore, Change Order/Quantity Adjustment No. 1 includes bursting of 800 linear feet of 8-inch wastewater line to 12-inch HDPE wastewater line along East Anderson Avenue and installation of 450 linear feet of 8-inch wastewater line by open-cut method along Lewis Street. The cost for these improvements is \$186,098. This will increase the contract total amount to

\$1,629,218.25.

The Code establishes side and rear setbacks for accessory buildings and structures in single family districts to prevent them from being too close to one another when located on adjacent lots. These include swimming pools, pool houses/cabanas, workshops, decks, storage sheds, barbeque structures, detached garages, playscapes, tree houses and other similar buildings or structures. This setback requirement is not necessary when the residential lot abuts property other than another residential lot, such as a drainage area or open space. The proposed revision to the setback requirement states that no setback is required when a rear or side lot line does not abut a developed or planned single-family lot. This allows property owners in these instances to place accessory structures closer to the property line.

The Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on July 15, 2020 and voted 4-3 to recommend approval of the Code revision. There were no speakers at the public hearing.
