We would like to request the removal of tree #137. According to the survey it is a 24" diameter oak tree. This tree was not mentioned as an issue in the first round of comments of our Site Development Plans. So we planned our site accordingly. It wasn't until the final plan that tree #137 was re-measured at 26.75" and it was determined to be a Post Oak, and classified as a monarch tree.

Our property on 1651 Sam Bass Road has many restrictions. 2 acres are in a flood plain and will be used for the Brushy Creek Trail. A large 50 ft easement for ONCOR runs down the middle of our property making it very difficult property to develop. We exhausted every effort with our Civil Engineer on where to place the building. If we shift the building forward toward Sam Bass, we would be encroaching the 25ft easement required by the city. If we shift the building to the west we would have the same issue with a much bigger monarch tree. If we are unable to move tree #137 it will be difficult for this property to accommodate our young, growing congregation.

We truly love our city and have been awarded by the city of Round Rock with the "Community Heart Award" by Joe Brehm in 2014, 2015, 2016. We are humbly asking you to please consider allowing us to move this tree so we build our church for the community.
