D.1 Consider a presentation and update from the Round Rock Chamber.

Staff members from the Round Rock Chamber gave an update to the City Council regarding activities this quarter regarding business retention, business attraction and other items that the Chamber is working on.

D.2 Consider a presentation and discussion regarding possible amendments to the City's noise regulations related to amplified sound.

City Manager, Laurie Hadley presented staff's plan for the change in the noise ordinance for the MU-1 area downtown. Staff is proposing that after 10 on weekdays (Sunday through Thursday)

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- after midnight on weekends (Friday to and Saturday), establishments will have to comply with residential noise restrictions.

In addition, a permit process to be put in place for businesses for amplified sound. Permits will be good for one year. If a business violates the restrictions 3 times in one year, their permit will be revoked, and a business will not be eligible to get another permit for one year from the revocation.
